

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2023 has been a most wonderful year for Brothers – especially from a playing perspective right across our senior, junior and touch programs. The highlight, of course, was winning six out of the seven senior rugby grand finals we contested: certainly one of our most – if not the most – successful playing seasons in our club's proud 118 year history. This result is amplified by the fact that 10 out of a total 11 of our senior teams made the finals series. These performances, plus the points contribution of our vastly improved women's side, resulted in Brothers comprehensively taking the Doughty Shield – a true demonstration of the enviable depth of our club.

I will round out a summary of the overall playing program soon, but I want to revisit the board's vision at a macro level and touch on key elements of this.

When I took over the Presidency two years ago, I unashamedly said that our goal was to make Brothers the "best community rugby club" in Australia – something which we genuinely believe that we not only have the foundation to become, but what this most magnificent club deserves. And I unequivocally mean that: the contributions this club has made to rugby in Australia and on a global stage – in terms of premierships won, representative players produced, administratively especially with respect to board leadership roles at the national and state bodies, and in terms of the general philosophy and operation of the game – are phenomenal and arguably on any measure, unparalleled. We ARE a fair dinkum rugby club.

Now, as determining the "best community rugby club" in Australia is in many ways subjective and is dependent on so many factors, it's obviously a bit hard to definitively define, but I believe the pursuit of this 'title' is the most important thing. We unwaveringly remain – at a board and management level, but I'd also say the entire Brothers family – totally committed to achieving this. As an side, I've always liked the title of the much acclaimed management text book, "In Search of Excellence", because in my opinion while you can never achieve excellence – whether this be in business, sport, life or whatever – the pursuit of it is the most critical and worthy thing.....and that's what we're aiming to do at Brothers across all aspects of club life.

As we all know, there are many elements that make up the Brothers' operation:

- 1. Leadership, governance, administration, staffing, values
- Culture and behaviour.
- 3. Playing program (the players, coaches and coaching, support staff)
- 4. Commerciality

I will touch on these briefly to put in the context of the year-in-review. And while I earnestly believe that we have performed very well in these elements, the one area that could be interpreted as a "dampener" this year is the end-financial result. However, I want every member to be rest assured that this has been, is and will continue to be a core focus of the board and management. The fundamentals of a strong foundation have been set up with much needed financial investment in 2023 to ensure a sound financial platform is delivered in the years going forward.

I will touch on this through my analysis and Simon will do so more comprehensively in his Treasurer's Report.

#### Leadership, Governance, Administration, Staffing, Values

I think we've got this area pretty right at Brothers at the moment although like all aspects it really is a case of ongoing continuous improvement. Like other predecessor boards and committees at the club over the years, we have quality members who bring different and complementary strategic and commercial skills to the table and all of whom put in a big effort in so many different ways. Lochie and Steeley – in their respective executive leadership roles at an operational/commercial level and in the broader rugby space – are doing a sensational job, have excellent working relationships with the Committee, and their formal appointment in the second half of last year has paved the way for our very strong foundation that is certainly paying dividends. The rest of the staff are performing strongly in supporting our leaders. They are all very committed and professional, and with a few tweaks to their roles to suit the evolving needs of the club, we've got in place a well-oiled machine going forward. We uncompromisingly embrace and abide by our values at all times and some hard decisions we have made over the past few years have not only proven to be right, but are reaping rewards.

#### **Culture and Behaviour**

We've also worked very positively on the ethos of, and behaviour at, the club – both on- and off-the-field. As a critical and central part of this, the famous Brothers core culture – the intensity in the way we play the game and support our teams, our resilience, innovation, the camaraderie, the fun – remains sacrosanct. But we've also worked at bolstering areas such as ethics, integrity, transparency and other positive attributes.....not wanting to necessarily turn our players into "Mother Theresa's", after all we are a rugby club first and foremost and a pretty tough rugby club at that, but it is critical for our all our people: players, coaches, the board, staff, volunteers, supporters, etc, to realise that we need to live by our stated values at all times. And it's working – importantly, within the playing group and a big thank you to Club Captains Paddy O'Connor and Nick Cross and their club leadership team for their role in this including seamlessly integrating the women, lower grade and Colts players.

And can I say that in my opinion, this incredibly positive and united culture – from what I genuinely see as the best in Brisbane – was one of the main reasons we went so well this year. The unity across all grades was palpable throughout the season and certainly peaked on, and contributed to the successes of, Grand Final weekend.

As mentioned at the start of my address, 2023 was one of the most successful playing seasons in the history of Brothers. But it wasn't just in senior rugby – it was across-the-board and the following is a high level summary of representative honours during the year that paints such a positive picture.

Congratulations to everyone involved – the players, coaches, managers, support staff, parents and families, the Juniors and Touch sub-committees, board member Ben McCormack who has recently moved into the role of 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Coach for next season, our Manager of Touch Mitch Felsman, and above anyone else our Director of Rugby Damian Steele.

In saying all this and with the great results this year, I can assure you that we are not complacent in any way – in fact, we all got back to business for the 2024 season the day after Grand Final weekend.....well, two days later after the Mad Monday celebrations! But the reality is that Steeley and his team of coaches, managers and other advisers, are constantly in forward planning mode – for next season, the season after and beyond. We really are creating a strong and sustainable platform in and for playing and coaching development.

#### Commercial

As mentioned earlier, against a backdrop of a whole range of highlights at the club this year, perhaps the only negative was the end-financial result. But I want to assure you that we working very hard at rectifying this situation and as Simon will outline there is positive light at the end of the tunnel – both short and longer terms – and I'd really like to highlight the hard work and concerted efforts of Simon as Club Treasurer, Lochie as our General Manager-Commercial Operations, and fellow board members, Graeme Linklater and Scott Jenson.

After setting out our strategic direction, this year was always going to be a period of investment – within the strict and conservative confines of stringent budget parameters.

As Simon will highlight, our revenue base this year – including growth in sponsorships, other commercial partnerships and game day operations – actually grew by 10.3 percent, but we did have increased expenditure; major elements of which include:

- Considerable and unbudgeted expenses for much needed field repair and maintenance at the commencement of the season; something that was non-negotiable and considered one-off. Several strategies are being undertaken to make the on-going costs and management of the fields more sustainable
- Increases in our playing and coaching program budget which is mainly about keeping pace with the increasingly competitive environment in which we operate
- Higher salary costs due to appointment of two executive leaders and additional roles which have been tightened, but monies that have paved the way for our successes this year and going forward.

Please also note that from a revenue perspective, we did not hit targets for some key events such as the annual Test Lunch, Crosby Long Lunch and for reasons outside our control we weren't able to host our annual golf day (which will return next year). We host these and other events for a reason – from a social perspective for our members and supporters, but also critical as a revenue earner so we can deliver the rugby programs that a core club business. Can I implore all of you to get along to, and promote, such events and attendance at game days as much as possible.

As mentioned, Simon will give a more comprehensive insight and analysis of our budget position, but I want to reiterate to you and all members and supporters that we are not only getting this under control but are setting a strong and sustainable platform for the years ahead.

#### Redevelopment Project

I'd also like to give you a quick update on the redevelopment activity. As you know, at a macro level our plans have been put on hold due to the interfacing between the State Government, Brisbane City Council and plans for the Olympics. We've remained in touch with both parties as well as other key stakeholders in the precinct – Queensland Cricket, Racing Queensland, the Federal Government and the local community. I have to say that a few months ago I was a little questioning of the project – mainly because of our current financial priorities – but diving deep into where we are and what we need to do, and I can't thank enough Project Director John Shepherd and Graeme as Chairman of the PCG, I am personally very positive towards the planned approach and key aspects including timing, sequencing, programming and capital stacking for each phase. John and Graeme continue to work diligently on this and are making good headway, and I'm thinking that we'll be able to have a formal member update and briefing in the 1st/2nd quarter next year.

So, in conclusion, I would like to highlight and thank a few people who have all assisted in making 2023 a terrific season at the club. Firstly, to all of you and the other members of Brothers, our players, coaches and support staff, my fellow board members – and I do make special mention of retiring members Bernie Hogan and Jon Irwin both of whom are Brothers to their boot-straps, have made an incredibly significant contribution to the club over many years and I know will continue to do so in the years ahead, and to whom I will soon make a special presentation, I also acknowledge other retiring board members – Anita Fogg and Ben McCormack, the management and staff – Lochie, Steeley, Dayna, Karen, Nicole, Jason, Mitch and Ava, our wonderful sponsors and corporate partners, and of course the many thousands of supporters who bleed blue and white and make all of this so worthwhile.

Thank you and here's to another successful year in 2024.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the audited financial statements and Treasurer's Report of Brothers Rugby Club ("the Club" or "Brothers") for the year ended 31 October 2023.

#### **Financial summary**

The financial result for the year ended 31 October 2023 was a net loss of \$349,909 (2021: loss \$65,761) and reflects the investment in the much needed facilities and resources which has provided the Club with a solid platform moving into 2024 and beyond. This strategy has already crystallised in pockets with strong growth in the Sporting and Economic segments of the Club and strong support from Community partners leading into 2024.

In arriving at the loss there were some strong positive growth coming from two of the Club's segments – namely Sporting and Economic.

Sporting - The Club continues to have a strong foundation of members with 1,610 (15.6% increase on FY22) registered rugby players and 2,098 (23.2% increase on FY22) registered touch players. Income of \$784,350 generated from Sporting registrations represents a 19.2% increase on the prior year.

*Economic* – Food & beverage sales and profit contribution for the year of \$514,551 (2022 : \$325,540) and \$217,177 (2022 : \$126,832) respectively reflected the impact of changes made to the Club's offering in this area with a focus on enhancing the game day experience which resulted in an increase in sales income of 57.7%. The Club also received \$123,077 in grant funds which have been applied to capital facility works during the year.

Community – The principal contributors to the Community segment stem from funds obtained in respect of sponsorship and Club events. Sponsorship income of \$350,922 was similar to the prior year (\$369,147), however, the current year has been partially impacted by a doubtful debts raised in relation to 2022 sponsorship income which is now considered doubtful as the Club's 2022 major sponsor was placed into voluntary administration during the year. Income from Club events of \$175,068 represented a shortfall of \$149,304 from the prior year where attendees to the Club's premier event, Test Lunch, in particular were down.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

Total expenses for the Club were \$2,761,200 (2021: \$2,264,863) and include the following significant expenses:

- Wages and salaries \$670,624 (2022: \$528,214) reflecting the fact that FY22 did not have key
  executive positions in place for the first half of the year.
- Ground and facility management costs \$399,489 (2022: \$295,054) the year was impacted by required field upgrade expenses totalling \$156,943 to repair and maintain the fields to ensure to ensure a safe playing surface is maintained. This is a "one-off" cost with the benefits now being seen where the off-season works required is minimal.
- Food & beverage costs costs of \$297,177 (2022: \$198,708) reflected the increased business noted above with an overall favourable impact on the Club's financial position.
- Rugby & touch sporting expenses (excluding salaries and wages) costs of \$466,904 (\$400,152)
   reflecting the increase in sporting members.
- Club administration costs (excluding salaries and wages) costs of \$162,125 (2022: \$180,360) reflects a reduction in staff recruitment costs which were incurred in 2022.

#### Outlook

The focus for the 2023 year was one of operational restructure to provide a sound platform to ensure the growth opportunities of the Club are effectively and sustainably managed. In looking forward to 2024 the Club is well positioned to deliver a positive financial result. In this regard, the following actions are already in train:

- Registration and merchandise income is expected to grow 7%
- Sponsorship support is largely "locked in" delivering 15% + growth
- Events contribution is expected to return to 2022 levels with a focus on the Club's premier events and continued improvements to the home game experience
- Field and facility costs to decline 20% following the one-off costs required in 2023 to repair damaged facilities
- Kit and utility services to decline 15% following tender processes carried out during 2023.

The 2024 year is expected to provide a positive financial result whilst continuing to invest in facilities to ensure the sporting programs of the Club are properly supported.

#### Conclusion

As Treasurer, I would particularly like to thank the Club Secretary, Graeme Linklater, and President, Geoff Rodgers for the "everyday" support provided in ensuring we position the Club for future financial sustainability. In addition, the key members of the executive team, Lochie Lawrence and Damian Steele, I also thank for their diligence and strategic execution both in finance and operations. The commitment of the Club's finance team (namely Nicole Elkington and Des Hogan) has been tireless and the Club is truly thankful for their efforts. # **MODIFIED RUGBY PROGRAM (MRP)**





2023 was without a doubt the best year yet for the Brothers Modified Rugby Program (MRP) Community!

In 2024 Ginger Cloud Foundation's Modified Rugby Program (MRP) will celebrate a decade of delivering a world-first, touch-only modified form of rugby union with Brothers being our first MRP Club in 2014 with the pilot having only 16 participants.

Today, the MRP has over 300 Coaches, Player Mentors (Volunteers) and MRP Players in Queensland and the ACT who are active across our participating clubs.

In the MRP, neurodiverse young people (7-21+ years) with Autism, Down Syndrome, ADHD and other learning and perceptual disabilities (MRP Players) can play rugby with the support, guidance, and friendship of a Player Mentor (Volunteer).

Our Player Mentors are the magic and success of the MRP. These young adults make an impact in the life of a young person with disability in a deep, long-lasting way.

Our Player Mentors are young adults from rugby clubs, local schools and universities who provide guidance and friendship both on and off the field. These young adults support and encourage our MRP Players to have fun, feel safe and secure, be understood, experience success and belong. All Player Mentors have the chance to participate in Ginger Cloud Disability Inclusive

Leadership Programs, where they are nurtured and supported as they develop into a generation of young people for whom disability is normalised, an exciting addition to their future success.

Brothers currently offer 5 divisions - Juniors, Colts, 7's, 7's PLUS and our exciting new division PREM's (full rule touch rugby).

Our Brothers MRP Players and Player Mentors also have the opportunity to participate in our NEW Player2PlayerMentor Pathway (P2PM), this incredible pathway supports our MRP Players to learn, explore and experience leadership skills, via an e-learning animation series so they can then support other neurodiverse young people on and off the rugby field.

Our MRP Clubs support us in creating a space where neurodiverse young people, their families, carers and friends are included in the club community, a place where they can experience the sheer joy of being in a team sport, often for the first time.

MRP Season runs from April – July each year.





# **MODIFIED RUGBY PROGRAM (MRP)**





#### Background:

GingerCloud's MRP is a world first, modified form of touch only rugby where with Autism, Down Syndrome, ADHD and other learning and perceptual disabilities (MRP Players) can play rugby with the support, guidance, and friendship of a Player Mentor (Volunteer).

The MRP aims to move our MRP Players off the sidelines and into the main game.

The MRP was created by GingerCloud Foundation (whose co-founders are a family from Brothers Megan and Anthony Elliott) with the support of the Queensland Rugby Union (QRU) and Rugby Australia (RA).

In 2023, rugby clubs hosting MRP teams stretched from Sunshine Coast to Canberra with young people with disability participating across five MRP divisions, tailored specifically to meet their needs.

# ROHRIG ELITE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (EDP)

These blocks were developed to compliment our positive player approach of our three key selection criteria of Person, Player and Potential. As the program has grown immensely due to its success and reputation, our 2023 coaching staff also grew to further develop the professionalism and offerings of the EDP. A massive thanks to Tom Court, Dallan Murphy, Lachlan McKenzie, Brent Matchett and Eduardo Espinoza for their assistance throughout the year in delivering an outstanding on and off field program for our athletes. A special mention to Damian Steele for his huge contribution and involvement within not only the program, but the entire club to ensure the program was aligned with all desired outcomes of teams and coaches.

The 2023 season boasted another record-breaking year of achievement which included an outstanding 13 premier grade debuts, 2 Professional contracts, 5 Super Rugby debuts, 4 Academy Contracts, 6 Super Rugby 19's debuts, Colts 1 and 2 premierships, Premier Grade Premiership and Doughty Shield Champions. 

#### TONY SHAW --- PAUL MCLEAN STAND

The Round 6 home game against GPS on Saturday 6 May 2023, was a special day with the naming of the hill on the western side of the Jack Ross Oval to the Tony Shaw - Paul McLean Hill in acknowledgment of the contribution these two men have made to Brothers over the last 50 years.



#### **DES HOGAN OVAL**

The Round 13 home game against Norths on Saturday 24 June 2023, was a special day with the renaming of the bottom oval in the Brothers Rugby Crosby Park precinct from Vic Walsh to Des Hogan Oval.

A truly once in a generation event for the Club, with the last time this type of honour was marked was the naming of the No 1 oval, the Jack Ross Oval back in 1972.

Des began his association with Brothers as a player straight out of school from St Columban's College which was just up the hill at Albion Heights and has been a player, coach, manager, volunteer, committee member, tour organiser, office bearer and clubman. He has been involved with the Club's sub-junior (U13-U17), junior (U18-U19) and senior (open age groups) sections of our Club, from 1954 to 2023, and 70 years' service.

As a player Des played in Reserve (2nd), B (3rd) and C (4th) grades teams for Brothers between 1954 to 1959.

He has worked tirelessly as the longest serving Treasurer of our Club, from 2001 to 2014 to ensure the ongoing viability of the organisation and at our lowest point was probably the person who worked the hardest to save the Brothers Club from extinction. As the Chairman of both the sub-junior and junior sections of the Club through the 70's and 80's, he worked tirelessly to ensure the both the players & parents embraced the Brother ethos and worked towards the betterment of the Club.

# **CLUB NEWS**

Des also served as a committee member and deputy chairman of the Brothers Union Club (Brisbane) Ltd during the early 1980's.

Des has given a lifetime of service not only to his Club, but the code of Rugby football across Greater Brisbane. He has served on several sub-committees within both the Queensland Rugby Union and Queensland Junior Rugby Union with distinction.

Des has not only been involved with our Club between 1954 to 2023, but with a number of community organisations based around Crosby Park precinct and greater Brisbane region. Des has worked closely with both Queensland Cricket and Meals on Wheels, as the Brothers Representative (2001-2015) as they share our site at Crosby Park in Albion, to ensure a mutually beneficial relationship between our Organisations. These positive relationships ensured the continued lease renewals that have ensured that Brothers Rugby Club has called Crosby Park for nearly 75 years.

Des has also been Brothers Representative to the Southside Bingo Trust (1999-2023) for over 24 years, where he was responsible for working with the other stakeholders in the Trust like, to ensure a successful and sustainable relationship developed between our Club and other Community based Organisations.

Whilst stationed in Adelaide from 1973 to 1977, Des along together with another parent of boys at Rostrevor College, was instrumental in getting rugby introduced into the Independent Schools Sports Association of South Australia system and a rugby union competition was established due to this trailblazing work.

Des worked for the Pioneer Concrete Group from 1962 until his retirement in 1998. He worked in various states across Australia in a variety of senior accountancy / management positions. For the last 14 years of his career with Pioneer he was based in the Sydney Head Office and was the Group Financial Controller for Australia.

Des has demonstrated that his example and service to the Club and Community is contagious as now his children and grandchildren have all been involved with our Community. He is a shining light and mentor to people and demonstrates the "Club First" ethos that he lives by.



It is a year that we will always be recognised for, and will go down in the record books as one of the most successful in the Clubs history.

## The ARU have ruled on the criteria for a player to be known as a Wallaby or an Uncapped Wallaby:

- 1) Any player that is selected in a Wallabies squad and tours overseas with the national team is considered an Uncapped Wallaby, even if for any reason he is unable to play in a match,
- 2) Any player who was selected to assemble with a Wallabies squad and trained with the team in the lead-up to a Test during the period of the non-replacement rule in International Rugby is considered an Uncapped Wallaby; and/or

#### Notes to Financial statements

#### For the year ended 31 October 2023

The financial statements cover Brothers Rugby Club Inc. as an individual entity. Brothers Rugby Club Inc. is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 ('the Act').

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

#### 1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the Management Committee, the association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the policies outlined in notes 1 and 2 of these statements.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### 2 Summary of significant accounting policies

#### Income Tax

Under current legislation, the Association is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

In accordance with the Club Constitution and operations the Management Committee consider that the main purpose during the year is the encouragement of the game of Rugby, and as such income derived from all sources is exempt from income tax.

#### Notes to the financial statements

#### For the year ended 31 October 2023

#### Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

#### Registrations and Membership

Revenue from registrations and membership, and touch rugby are recognised when received.

#### Grants

Non-reciprocal grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the entity obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

#### Donations

Donations, pledges and bequests are recognised on an accrual basis and is recognised when the pledge is made. At that point it is considered that the economic benefit associated with the transaction will flow to the Association.

#### Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

#### Trust Distribution - Southside Unit Trust

Trust income is recognised when the present entitlement to the distribution has been established.

#### Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

#### Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

#### Notes to the financial statements

#### For the year ended 31 October 2023

#### Capital expenditure

Capital expenditure relates to the work undertaken prior to any development application (DA) being approved. This includes maintenance, upgrade of lights, field maintenance, other maintenance and professional fees associated with any DA process.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its recoverable amount.

#### **Employee benefits**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits relating to long service leave balances are the expected amounts to be paid and is accrued when an employee reaches 7 years of employment. Changes in measurement of the liability are recognised in the Income Statement.

#### Notes to the financial statements

#### For the year ended 31 October 2023

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

#### Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Management Committee evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

#### Key estimates

#### Investments

i. The club owns an asset being a perpetual membership at Ballymore. The historical cost of this asset is \$10,000. The lack of a ready market for this asset and the diminishing economic benefits following the reduction in games being played at Ballymore an impairment loss of \$9,999 has been raised to record the carrying value at \$1. This determination will be reviewed annually, and adjustments made in future periods if future market activity or estimate of future economic benefit indicates that such adjustments are appropriate.

### Property Plant & Equipment - useful life Buildings and leasehold improvements

- i. Crosby Park during 2016 the Association signed a 10 year lease with Brisbane City Council which expires on 26 April 2026. There is no expectation that the lease would not be renewed at the expiration of the lease term. As such the Management Committee consider a 50 year useful life appropriate for buildings and leasehold improvements.
- ii. Windsor Park in 2014 the previous junior Association signed a licence agreement with St Margaret's Anglican Girls School for access to the shared grounds and facilities at Windsor Park for all U6 to U9 games and training, U10 to U12 training and Association Events. The term of the agreement is 10 years (expires January 2024) and annual licence fees are payable on a monthly basis. There is no expectation that the lease would not be renewed at the expiration of the lease term.

#### **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result, and that outflow can be reliably measured.

#### Right of use assets

The association holds a licence to occupy Crosby Park and Windsor Park. The Association:

- Recognises right-of-use assets and lease liabilities in the statement of financial position, initially measured
  at the present value of the future lease payments
- Recognises depreciation of right-of-use assets and interest on lease liabilities in profit or loss
- Separates the total amount of cash paid into a principal portion (presented within financing activities) and interest (presented within financing activities) in the statement of cash flows.

Lease incentives (e.g.rent-free period) are recognised as part of the measurement of the right-of-use assets and lease liabilities. The right-of-use assets are tested for impairment on an annual basis.

#### 20 Capital Commitments - Masterplan

The Club may incur significant capital expenditure in the future due to the proposed Master Plan for Crosby Park.

During 2021, Stage 1 to the Master Plan was completed and is fully funded and the application for Development Approval for Stages 2,3, 4 & 5 was lodged with Brisbane City Council and approved.
