PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I'm delighted to record the year's achievements in the Club's Centenary Year.

The year has been a very successful one on and off the paddock, although if judged solely in terms of premierships, the year was a disappointing one.

7 of our 9 Brothers teams reached Semi Finals and four teams played in Grand Finals (Colts 1 and 3 and Division One, First Grade and Second Grade) and unfortunately we lost all four Grand Finals by narrow margins. Premier Grade came 3rd being defeated by Gold Coast 21-18 in the Preliminary Final.

All grades played attractive, attacking rugby scoring some sensational tries through the season and the spirit and camaraderie of the players from all grades this year was great.

Premier Grade performed exceptionally well and fairly consistently this year, with a tenacious pack and pace to burn out wide, they played some great rugby.

When our Red's players, David Croft (Captain of the end of season Reds Tour of Argentina), and Sean Hardman were available for the Club, particularly in the last round, their commitment and experience made a huge difference to our side. In particular, David's lead from the front approach to his captaincy was inspirational.

Thanks to the Premier Grade Coach and Club GM, Paul Mills, for your good work this year and over the last three years.

It is an inevitable position handling a lot of the administration and grounds issues as well as being responsible as Coach of Premier Grade. It is no coincidence though that the resurgence of the Club **across all grades has occurred on Millsy's watch.**

Millsy, thanks for your commitment and dedication to the job. Thanks also to your coaching and management team of Wayne Gibson, Peter Douglas and John Druery. Also, thanks to Ant Sauer for recognising and bringing to Brothers great talent for the future.

Congratulations to all the players, coaches and managers of all the Brothers teams for your efforts this **year. We're proud of you.**

To Owen Mayhew who stepped down as Chairman of the Board of Directors earlier this year and to Rick McKeon, the current Chairman, could I extend my sincere thanks for your commitment and contribution.

To all the individual Board members, could I also extend a very special thank you for your selfless contribution to the Club. To those stepping down from the Board, Anthony Wright, John Grainger, Brad Sherwin and Melissa Price, thank you for your work this year.

To assist in the workload involved with some of the additional social activities associated with the Centenary Year, Dick McGruther OBE chaired the Centenary Committee comprising, Denis Croft, Pat Oswald, Paul McLean MBE, David Dunworth, Col Paroz, Des Hogan, Graeme Woolnough, John Drury, Ron Price, Ross McKellar, Anthony McDermott and myself. The Club is heavily indebted to Dick and this group for their contribution in organising the Centenary Dinner held in April and the Centenary Lunch held in October.

The Centenary Dinner held at the Brisbane Convention Centre was a sensational night which attracted some 700 players, former players, officials and supporters, hosted by Chris Handy and David Fordham. The night recorded the history of the Club and those whose contribution has made the Club the great institution it is today.

The **Centenary Lunch held at Tattersall's Club attracted a packed house of 320 people and was a great success.** Our special guest was General Peter Cosgrove AC MC, former head of the Australian Defence Forces and our guest speaker was former Test cricketer, Kerry **O'Keefe**. **It is planned that we will continue with the Brothers lunch in the city on an annual basis.**

There were several other events held through the year to celebrate the Centenary Year.

The first for the year was the tournament for the Confederation of Brothers Clubs of Australia otherwise known as Fish Fest with Brothers Clubs from Perth, Cairns, Rockhampton, Townsville and Mackay participating. The tournament was won by Brothers Brisbane.

Thanks to Anthony McDermott and John Druery for their excellent organisation of this fun event. The weekend went off without a hitch.

In July, we held the Tradition Match as part of our Centenary celebrations, against our traditional rival, University. It was a home game at Crosby which attracted a large crowd of supporters and sponsors (won handsomely by Brothers).

Another initiative of the Centenary Committee, championed by Pat Oswald, was the striking of Centenary medals for each player and official representing the Club this year.

It was very pleasing to see Des Hogan receive a well deserved Life Membership for his long serving devotion to the Club. Congratulations Des and thank you for your long years of service and the many hours you devote to the Club week in, week out.

The Club has committed to publishing a book on the history of the Club. Thanks to John Druery and Anthony McDermott for your tireless work in researching our past and to the Centenary Committee, in particular David Dunworth for championing the project. Jim Tucker is writing and compiling the book which will be available in the New Year.

At several Centenary functions, we were graced with the presence of two of our oldest Life Members, Kevin Fegan and Jack Buchanan. Both have given great service to the Club and it was great to welcome them back.

Thanks to our band of volunteers who have assisted selflessly this year. A thin line unfortunately and consequently a lot fell to this group in a very busy year. Many thanks.

A particular thank you to the Club doctor and stalwart, Dr Peter Andersen, who was always on hand when required and was kept particularly busy on home games. Particularly pleasing to have you accept Life Membership of the Club this year in recognition of your long years of involvement with the Club.

There was great support for the presentation of Trophies Night with almost 200 attending thanks to Ant Sauer (and Paul Mills) for taking charge of the event and putting together a fabulous night.

GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

Preseason

The preseason saw Brothers Ruby Club host the Brothers Rugby Fraternity Clubs at Crosby Park to compete for the Andrew Pacey Memorial Shield.

The weekend was an enormous success with Brothers teams coming from Cairns, Townsville, Mackay, Rockhampton, Perth and Brisbane.

The host Club also invited the Brisbane Irish Rugby Club to take part and we supplied 2 sides (T.J. Colton XV & A.McE. Oxenham XV) to make up 8 teams for a Round Robin Tournament.

The two Brisbane sides played the first match of the tournament and this was taken out by the Oxenham team who went on to play Brothers Mackay final and eventually winning by a slender margin of 12-10.

Representative Players

The season started without our usual Super 12 players in Elton Flatley, Sean Hardman and David Croft but it also saw 3 of our up and coming players being involved in the U19 Rugby World Cup in South Africa with Tajohn Mailata, Scott Daruda and Sean Hennessy all being selected to represent Australia on the tour.

Tajohn and Scott were to represent Australia at the U21 World Challenge later in the year and both eventually took up contracts with the new Super 14 franchise in Perth and will be lost to the club in 2006.

Nathaniel Gendle, Ben McCormack, Adam Dance, Sean Hennessy and James Harvey were all selected to play in the Old U19 Trans-Tasman team which took place at the end of the season with Sean having to withdraw through injury.

Elton Flatley got the chance to represent Wallabies one more time before doctors ordered the former Wallaby Vice-Captain to take the rest of the season off to try to recover from concussion related injuries.

David Croft would go on and for Australia A against the Junior All Blacks and later Captain the team against the French Barbarians.

Season Proper

The club would field 10 teams in various **divisions in 2005 with 3 teams in the colts' competitions, 2 teams in the Normanby Cup Friday night comp, a team in the Division 3A comp, 3 teams in Division 1 and a Premier grade team in the Brisbane Premier competition.**

All teams performed with distinction and their efforts were rewarded with 7 teams making it into the finals series and 4 teams going on to play in a Grand Final. Colts 1, Colts 3, Div. 1 1st Grade & Div. 1 2nd Grade all progressed to their Grand Finals without success.

Premier Grade **and Normanby Cup "Old Bhoys" team were narrowly defeated in their Preliminary Finals** and Div. 1 2nd Grade were defeated 6-5 by the eventual grand final winners in their knock out Semi-Finals.

Although we didn't win a Grand Final, the effort to have so many teams take part in a finals series is something to be very proud of and something you would have to track back to one of the "Golden Era's" of the club, the early 1980's, to compare similar efforts regarding teams taking part in finals.

Congratulations goes to all the players for their efforts in season 2005 and a special "Thank You" goes to the volunteer coaches, managers, strappers, runners etc. who give up their time every week to ensure we put teams on the field.

All in all, a great year on the field and we look forward to stepping up in season 2006 and going that little bit further with the results.

CAXTON CUP - Brisbane Premier North

In another innovation the QRU introduced the Caxton Cup, a game played between non-contracted players from the North side clubs against those from South of Brisbane River.

Brothers' contingent in the Brisbane Premier North team performed soundly in the 48 - 32 point defeat to Brisbane South in the Caxton Cup at Ballymore on Sunday. Brothers were represented by Andrew Cox, Andrew Coady, Simon Reid, Damon Murphy, Anthony Pyers and George Tagikacibau in the starting 15 and Patrick Beckett, Simon Price and David Eri on the bench.

George Tagikacibau scored the first points for the match with a try out wide. The blustery conditions played havoc with kicking and long passes and also affected the lineout throws. Damon Murphy and Anthony Pyers both made strong contributions in attack in the first half breaking the line on several occasions but both suffered injuries soon after the start of the second half and were replaced. David Eri coming onto the wing scored a good try.

In the forwards Simon Reid was also replaced with injury and Simon Price entered the field as his replacement. Patrick Beckett performed well initially in the second row and then was even more involved when given a run as blind side flanker.

The players enjoyed the experience of joining with fellow non contracted players from other Brisbane north side Clubs and the game was entertaining given the conditions.



Andrew Pacey Memorial Shield

To start the centenary Celebrations Brothers hosted the Andrew Pacey Memorial Shield at Crosby Park in February. Brothers Rugby Clubs in Cairns, Townsville, Mackay, Rockhampton and Perth were represented in the tournament, joining two teams from the host Club. Brisbane Irish Rugby Club also participated as special guests.

The teams were placed in two pools of four teams each, with the winner of each pool meeting in the final. The day started in front of a good crowd at 10AM as the two local teams clashed providing an entertaining opening. Matches continued throughout the day and despite the hot weather some entertaining rugby was witnessed.

As a preliminary to the final a Brothers Brisbane U16 team played against the visiting Perth Brothers U16 and secured a victory. In the main final one of the Brothers Brisbane sides, the Oxenham XV named after an early pioneer of the club, played Mackay. In a hard fought game, the local side managed to hang on for a 12 - 10 victory.

At the post match function, the Shield was handed on to the Oxenham XV captain Godfrey Esmonde and Lachlan Burke of the Brisbane team was named player of the tournament. The occasion was made even more auspicious with the presence of Bill Pacey, the father of Andrew Pacey, at the celebration dinner.

Premier Grade

2005 PRELIMINARY FINALISTS

The season kicked off for Premier Grade with the preseason cup. Brothers were the defending holders of this cup but missed a place in the final, finishing third. The preseason saw several new players trialled in the top grade of football and many of these were to contribute to the Premier Grade season, throughout the year. Some of the most impressive included Paul Doneley on the wing and Al McClay at loose forward. The season started with two losses to Sunnybank and Gold Coast but Brothers then remained undefeated through the first round, a draw with GPS being the only time the team failed to register a win. The team was aided with the return of experienced second rower Nathan Ross and prop John Bosanquet from stints overseas. The second half of the season also saw the loss of Darren Murphy to Japan and David Collis to Sydney. Both these players had been strengths of the team throughout the first round of competition. These losses were offset to some extent by the return of David Croft and Sean Hardman from the Reds for the second round. Both contributed significantly individually and as team leaders. The open rounds saw Brothers again go down to Sunnybank and Gold Coast.

The season got back on track with a big win over Sunshine Coast with Elton Flatley making a rare club appearance. In a disappointing result Easts defeated Brothers and GPS won a tight game at Crosby Park with a try on the bell. Brothers steadied though the closing rounds to secure third place on the competition ladder going into the finals. Anthony Sauer on the wing was a standout during the season and finished as the teams leading try scorer.

The Minor Semi Final saw Brothers v GPS at Ballymore and in a close game Brothers managed to get home. This set up a Preliminary Final with Gold Coast. Brothers lost Sean Hardman and centre Anthony Pyers on match eve but put in a strong and courageous performance to go down by 3 points. In particular the smaller Brothers forward pack showed great determination against far bigger opponents. It was a disappointing loss for the team after coming so far, falling just short of a Grand Final appearance in the clubs Centenary Year.

Dan Woolnough, the club captain, club stalwart and retiring player at the end of year declared the game as the best he has been involved in at Brothers – enough said. From CHRISTIAN BROTHERS' COLLEGE FOOTBALL CLUB to BROTHERS' OLD BOYS RUGBY CLUB

AN HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

Brothers have a long and rich tradition in rugby union in Queensland. Since forming in 1905 the Club has produced 75 Internationals, 196 Queensland players and have won 26 Brisbane "A" Grade premierships (25 QRU, 1 BRL), more than any other club. Among the list of notables produced by Brothers are six Wallaby captains, JP "Jimmy" Flynn, Des Connor, Paul McLean, Anthony Shaw, Rod McCall and John Eales.

The Brothers Old Boys Football Club was formed at a meeting held at the Carlton Club Hotel on March 2 1905. Mr. D Carter chaired this meeting which elected Rev T Hayes as Patron, F McDonnell, MLA as President, and J P Rorke as Hon Secretary and Treasurer. The management committee comprised T Gaffney, F Ahern, T J Lehane, P Dwyer, J Bolton, D J O'Connell, V Meaham and C O'Sullivan. It further decided at this meeting to "play in the school colours, blue and white hoops". These were the St Joseph's College Gregory Terrace colours of the time. The new club was primarily formed by old boys of this school, St Joseph's Nudgee College and St James College, also Christian Brothers School's. In 1905 the team played in plain hoops but the Scottish supplier incorrectly sent navy and white irregular hoops ("butcher stripes") for the 1906 season and the club has stuck with these ever since, apart from a brief period during WW2.

At the second meeting, held at the York Hotel on March 29 1905, a full committee was elected. The first captain for the 1905 season was Tom Gaffney. After three trial games the clubs first competition match was against North Brisbane (the previous seasons premiers) and resulted in an 8 - 0 loss to the Brothers team. Brothers failed to reach the finals in their first season. In 1906 the legendary Phil Carmichael joined Brothers from South Brisbane and captained the team to their first Premiership victory in 1907 with a win over Valleys 18 - 8.

In addition to Carmichael, many Brothers players from the early days were prominent on the representative scene including Voy Oxenham, Tom Colton, Jack Fihelly, Peter Flanagan and Albert Scanlan. Brothers played a "club championship" match against Sydney premiers Glebe at the start of 1908 in Brisbane but lost 9 - 0.

Brothers' next major success came in the "first golden era" in the club's history with premierships in 1911, 12, 13, 15 and, following the break for WW1, 1919. Also in this time Brothers won the Hospital Cup (then a challenge trophy match generally held midseason) in 1910, 1911, 1913, 1914 & 1915 and again following the war in 1919. Prominent players in this time included Pat Murphy (Brothers first wholly produced international) and JP "Jimmy" Flynn who debuted for QLD as a 17-year-old, captained his state at 18 and remains Australia's youngest ever captain when given the role aged 20 years and 39 days in 1914.

In 1913 nine Brothers players represented Queensland in the interstate clash in Sydney and helped the team to a 22 - 21 victory. In addition to Pat Murphy and Jimmy Flynn these players were M J McMahon, R McManus, Hugh Flynn, Vin Carmichael, Tom Ryan, Bill Morrissey and Joe Russell. Another Brothers player to be selected for state and country during these years was R "Clinker" Birt.

Brothers were such a strong club in these years that they entered two team's "A" & "B" in the senior premiership in 1914 with the teams meeting each other in the Hospital Cup. Both sides were strong and contained internationals and interstate representative players. During these pre-war years Brothers also won the inaugural "College" grade competition in 1911.

The Australian Team that played the New Zealand "All Blacks" in the Second Test at the Gabba on

1st August 1914 involved no less than eight Brothers players. Six players, Jimmy Flynn (Captain), Pat Murphy, John "Bluey" Thompson, R. "Clinker" Birt, Sime Kreutzer and Bill Morrissey were in the starting side and the Swenson brothers Francis and William were the two uncapped replacements. New Zealand went on to win the Test by 17 points to nil and this match would be the last Test match to be played in Brisbane until the revival of the code in 1929.

The long tradition of clashes with University first began in senior competition on June 8 1912, with Brothers' running out victors, 24 points to nil. The tradition of hard, close fought games between these two Clubs' remains a feature of the Brisbane club scene and there have been many memorable tussles over the years, particularly in Grand Finals.

The QRU Management Committee had suspended Senior Grade football from 1916-18, so in an attempt to keep its members and supporter base together during these dark times Brothers Club Committee decided to field teams in the QRL Competition. Brothers remained affiliated with the QRU throughout this period, so the Committee decided it would be confusing to use the name "Brothers" in the QRL competition. The Senior Committee fielded a team under the name of Merthyr Football Club; as most of the Brothers Officials of the day resided in Merthyr, and went on to appear in the 1917 and 1918 Grand Finals losing both to Valleys. With the success of the Senior Grade team, the Club's Junior Committee decided to field a side in the 1918 QRL Junior Premiership. The Carlton Football Club as it would be known, was named after the Carlton Club Hotel in which Brothers was founded, achieved immediate success winning the Junior 1st Grade Premiership.

The end of the 1919 season saw the demise of Rugby Union in Queensland and the old QRU clubs; Brothers, University, Past Grammar and Valley then joined the QRL competition for the 1920 season. The 1920's were a lean period as far as premiership success went, with Brothers only winning the 1926 "A" grade premiership by defeating Coorparoo by 6 points to 5. The Club won a record four consecutive Pike Cups in 1923, 24, 25, 26 and therefore was entitled to keep the cup.

Brothers produced some outstanding players during this decade such as Sime Kreutzer, Jimmy Flynn and John "Bluey" Thompson, who all played for Queensland and Australia in Rugby Union, J. Daly, Jerry Allman, Ernie Riipinen, J. O'Mara and Tommy Gorman represented the state. Gorman came to the Club from Toowoomba Brothers in 1926 for a then record sign on fee of 400 pounds; he was also the Club coach from 1926 to 1928. Tommy Gorman also went on to win international honours and captain Australia against Great Britain in the 1928 Test Match series in Australia. Jimmy Flynn, who after his career as a player, went on to be a coach of the Club. A watershed in Brother's history came in 1929 when the then Club President Mr. Stan Ross and leading players Tommy Gorman and Jerry Allman resigned from the Christian Brothers Old Boys Football Club and founded the Past Brothers Rugby League Football Club, which then saw two "Brothers" Clubs playing in club competitions in Brisbane.

Two Brothers stalwarts in Jack Ross and J P Flynn were heavily involved in the activities that saw the return of club Rugby Union to the state in the late 1920's. Brothers returned to rugby union in 1930, but the 1930's and early 1940's were a lean period as far as premiership success went. Brothers did however produce some outstanding players. In the 1930's players such as Frank and Len Arnell, Pat Banks, Hughie and Jimmy Bowers, Terry Brown, Joe Costello, Vince Dore and Joe French all represented the state. Pat Banks and Jack Howard went on to win international honours. Other notable Brothers players from the late thirties and into the forties included Kevin Fegan and Vince McLoughlin.

Competition continued throughout the Second World War and as this conflict drew to a close Brothers, started to once again move into a "golden period". With the likes of dashing young centre "Kanga" Kennedy, Kev Hodda, "Wallaby" Bob McMaster, Kevin Bourke and Bryan O'Connell contributing, Brothers secured their first trophy in the senior competition since the

recommencement of competition with a 13 - 6 victory over University in the final of the mid-season Tom Welsby Cup in 1945.

Brothers went on that year to contest the premiership final but went down to University. It was the start of a bright period for the club, a "second golden era" that saw premiership wins in 1946, 1949, 1950, 1951 and 1953. The coach of the Brothers team throughout this period was Joe French, who had first played for Brothers while still at school in 1932. This era also saw the emergence of players such as Tom and Kevin Maccheroni and Bill Maloney. In 1949 Bryan O'Connell is recorded as having completed 230 "A" grade games for Brothers. Two other influential administrators associated with Brothers over these years, and to remain with the club for many years to come, were Jack Ross and Charles Dahl.

Jack Ross was chairman of the QRU when meetings were held with representatives of NSW and other states to form the ARU at the end of the Second World War. Tom McCormack, a Brothers' supporter, though never a player due to the effects of polio in childhood, was also involved in these discussions and later went on to become president of the QRU and chairman of the ARU. Primarily due to the efforts of Greg Lalor and Joe French, Brothers become the first club in Brisbane to have their own ground at Crosby Park, Albion. The original arrangement began with the QRU as leaseholder in 1949 but Brothers took over the lease in their own right in 1951. Club Treasurer at the time, Kevin Hodda, who after his career as a player went on to be a coach and administrator, remembers prior to the move to Crosby Park training under street lights in New Farm Park. It is reported that Tom McCormack made a grant of funds to the club to allow work to commence on the "Green Shed", a building to serve as dressing rooms and bar for the club for many years to come.

The success of the late forties and early 1950's was not repeated for more than a decade, except for a premiership win in 1959. This was despite the appearance of such high quality players as Des Connor (later to captain Australia and the All Blacks and to follow his playing career with a stint as national coach), Len Forbes, Vince Hogan, John Patane, Harry Roberts and Kevin Ryan. Following the 1959 premiership win things reached possibly the lowest ebb ever for the club. The year 1963 saw the club struggle to field a competitive team but things began to turn around in 1964. A stand out for Brothers in these lean years was Dallas O'Neill who represented his state and country throughout the early 1960's and captained Queensland in 1964. Paddy Knapp was another prominent representative player from Brothers during this time. Jim Kenny came onto the scene as "A" grade coach in 1965 and took the side to the premiership in 1966.

The late sixties is remembered for such players as David L'Estrange, Barry Honan, Epi Bola, Paul and Greg Bone, Vince Heffernan, Alex Pope, Mick Barry, Mick Purcell, Peter Reilly, Rod Kelleher, Peter Moore and Shane Sullivan being a part of strong Brothers outfits that took the premiership again in 1968 and 1971.

Brothers continued to produce international players with sixteen players coming from the club to the Queensland side in 1972 and four touring France with the 1971 Wallabies. These players were Jeff McLean in the backs and forwards David L'Estrange, Mick Flynn and David Dunworth. The Brothers pack that year also contained Greg Bone, Chris Handy, Dick McGruther and Mick Freney, forming a formidable hurdle for any opposing teams. Queensland players of this period included Ron Price, Billy Andrews and Mick Flynn.

In 1973 the club had one of their most successful years winning all but the Reserve Grade Premiership in which they were runners up. This period was again the start of a "third golden era" for the club as "A" Grade premierships continued in 1974, 1975, 1978 and then an unbroken record of five in a row from 1980 to 1984. This gave the club 10 premierships in a 14-year period from 1971 to 1984.

The resurgence of Brothers in this period contributed greatly to the Queensland Rugby revival. In 1974 brothers contributed 13 players to the Queensland team including David Logan, Geoff White, Dick Cocks, Brian Howell and Hud Rickett. Ron Price was the coach of Brothers for much of this period including the five consecutive grand finals. And the player depth continued with the emergence of Tony Shaw, Mark and Shane Nightingale, Danny Tighe, Peter Lavin, Paul Costello, Paul Mills, Brendan Moon, Ross Hanley, Tony D'Arcy and the mercurial Paul McLean. Of these both, Tony Shaw and Paul McLean would go on to captain Australia.

Brothers only other success in the 1980's came in 1987. During this time, future Queensland and Australian coach John Connelly took over the coaching reins and the club saw players such as Mark McBain, Peter Grigg and Damien Frawley contribute on the field. The late 1980's heralded the emergence on the representative scene of Dominic Maguire and Rod McCall, the latter going on to a long-term international career for Australia.

The "A" grade premiership successes have been missing from the club since 1987 though there have still been victories in other grades and in the colts. Particularly memorable was the 1989 Colts 1 victory that heralded the arrival of a young John Eales on the club rugby scene. Eales was to go on to become a long serving Wallaby captain, including bringing home the 1999 World Cup.

The early 1990's also saw Illie Tabua play a prominent role in Brothers and Queensland teams as well as national duty for his adopted Australia.

Brothers continue to produce quality players such as current Queensland Reds players Elton Flatley, David Croft, Sean Hardman and Sam Cordingley, as well as a number of players who have or who are currently playing for other Australian Provinces, the N.S.W. Waratah's and A.C.T. Brumbies. Current Premier Grade Player's Ant Sauer and Damon Murphy have also represented Australia in 7's.

While Brothers have produced many fine players the Club's contribution to rugby also extends to administration of the code. The likes of Redmond Byrne from the 1910's, Jack Ross and Mick Lyons in the 1930's and 40's, Kev Hodda in the 50's, Dick McGruther in the 70's and 80's and Paul McLean as the current president of the ARU have all contributed to the growth of Rugby in Queensland. People such as Tom McCormack in the early fifties contributed greatly to the Queensland and Australian Rugby Unions.

There have been many others who after a career as players have continued their role within the code. People like Tom Sweeney who was heavily involved in the establishment of the "Junior" (referring to Colts U19 level) Rugby Union in the early 1960's. This system of developing players added considerably to the strength of Rugby Union in Queensland in the following years. The club has also produced many fine coaches at state and national level, extending from Joe French in the 1940's to Des Connor and Jim Kenny in the 1960's and 70's, to Ron Price in the 1980's and John Connelly and Mark McBain in the 1990's and 2000's.
