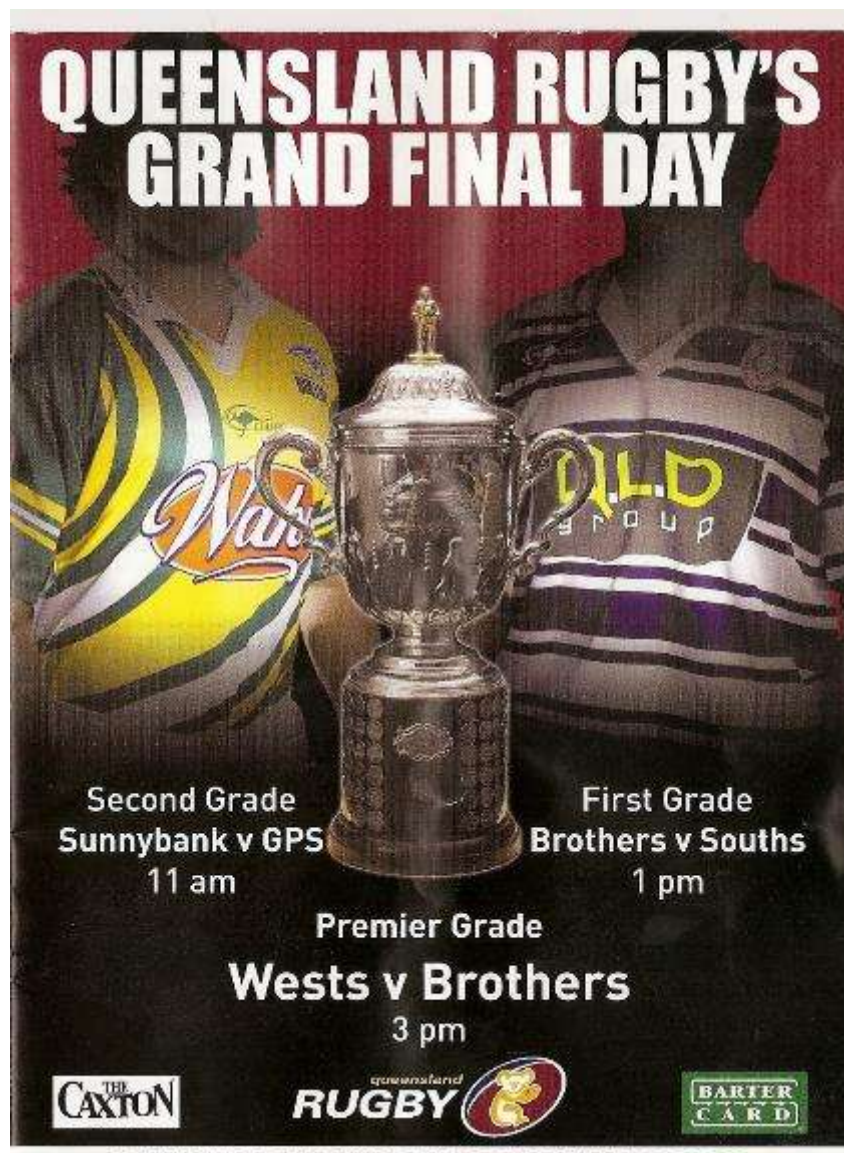

To support Dennis' nomination an outline of Crofty's contribution to the Club as a player, coach and as an official of the Club for a period of nearly 40 years was submitted by his sponsors:

- As a player commencing with the Colts in 1967 and playing through the grades including first grade during a period up until 1972.
- As a player for a further period from 1975 until 1984, playing in most of the open grade teams during that period.
- As a captain/coach of both the second and third grade teams on several occasions during this second playing period.
- As a player Dennis appeared in two second and two third grade premierships winning teams.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

As in past years Brothers Rugby Club was able to field 10 teams ranging from Colts 3 through to Premier, with the inclusion this season of a rejuvenated Women's team after a five year absence. Six teams went on to play in the finals series, four of those in Grand Finals.

The women's team was knocked out in the semi-finals and Colts 2 in the preliminary final. The Friday night Normanby Cup team lost the Grand Final 18-7 to East Longhorns, Colts 3 won their Grand Final 18-5 against a previously unbeaten Goodna, Division 1 1st Grade lost their Grand Final 28-20 to Souths and Premier team went down in the dying minutes 23-22 to Wests.

There were a number of outstanding team efforts throughout the season, however special mention must go to Colts 3 who had never beaten Goodna, the undefeated minor premiers of 2006, until Grand Final day. The club congratulates coach Tristan Condon, his support staff and the players for a tremendous effort.

The Premier team made the club's first Grand Final appearance at that level since 1990. The team was led by David Croft who returned from Super 14 and Australia A duties to take over from Andrew Coady who did an excellent job for most of the season. The club would like to congratulate Nathan Ross for his personal milestone of 100 Premier grade games. With an average age of 22, the club hopes the team stays together for a number of years and gets to live the dream of Premiership success.

Sadly 2006 saw the premature retirement of Elton Flatley on medical grounds. We wish Elton every success and thank him for his wonderful contribution to Brothers Rugby Club, Queensland and Australian Rugby.

A number of players earned representative honours in 2006: Elton Flatley, Sam Cordingley, David Croft & Sean Hardman in the Super 14, with Sam and Sean going on to make the Wallaby squad and be rewarded with Test appearances, while David received Australia A honours. Anthony Sauer and Damon Murphy were selected in the Aussie 7's team with Damon taking part in the Commonwealth Games in Melbourne. Boom colts Ben McCormack and Adam Dance represented Qld in the Trans-Tasman U19 team while team mate Sitani Satui represented Samoa in the U19 RWC. Annette Finch, Megan Stiffler and Ili Batibasaga were selected in the Qld women's team with Annette and Ili representing Australia at the Rugby World Cup held in Canada.

COMMONWEALTH GAMES - Melbourne



DAMON MURPHY:

Rugby 7s was one of the core sports of the 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games and to add even more excitement to the event Brothers' own Damon Murphy was a member of the Australian 7's Team. This Australian Team consisted of players of the calibre of former Brothers' player Scott Fava, Matt Giteau, Chris Latham and Lote Tuqiri.

With one gold medal on offer, 16 teams will compete at Telstra Dome in Docklands over two days (16-17 March) of competition based on the rules of the International Rugby Board (IRB) and with a format similar to that of all Rugby 7s World Series events.

A total of 42 games were played, and teams competed in four pools in a round-robin format. Performance within the pools will determine each team's progression through to the final rounds. Australia was drawn in Pool C which also contained England, Cook Islands and Sri Lanka.

Australia finished second in its pool recording its only loss against England 14-12; this meant they would play South Africa in the Medal Quarter Final Game. This tightly contested game ended in Australia winning by 20-14.

The defending Commonwealth Games gold medallists New Zealand went on to win their third consecutive Gold Medal in the Rugby 7s after defeating England 29-21. England defeated Fiji 21-14 and New Zealand defeated Australia 21-19 to advance to the Final. In the play-off for the Bronze Medal Fiji beat Australia 24-17.

MELISSA PRICE:

I was very proudly appointed a Resident Centre Coordinator in January 2006, working with a small team of 5 Coordinators to manage the day to day operations of 9 Resident Centre', their 26 full time staff and 120 Volunteers. A Resident Centre is an Athlete or Official's Lounge Room. In the House's where the Athletes and Officials were accommodated, the houses were literally beds and bathrooms. Some of the houses were converted to sleep between 25 – 35 people in twin or triple share rooms. The kitchens and laundries were sealed closed and the garage was converted into bedrooms. Athletes and Officials were accommodated in all-new buildings in the Village, and through the 'low rise' nature, the accommodation provided easy access to disabled athletes and officials. The scheme allowed for 75 per cent of residents to be housed in permanent dwellings and 25 per cent in relocatable/portable structures.

The Athletes and Officials would then come to the Resident Centre to hang out and relax. They would come to use the laundry facilities (washing machines, dryers, irons and ironing boards), use the internet facilities, telephones to call home, watch free to air TV, watch live feeds to all venues with live competition and results, they could have a tea or coffee, play board games or cards, we would also help them with information on Victoria and Melbourne and just generally be there as a friendly ambassador for the Melbourne Commonwealth Games and for Australia.

We came in contact with over 6,200 athletes from 71 nations. We had the luxury of interacting with some of the world's elite athletes in their natural environment of their home away from home. I had the pleasure of meeting and having my photo taken with the World Record Holder and Commonwealth Games 100m sprint Gold Medalist (10.03sec) Asafa Powell, Waisale Serevi (the flying Fijian 7's player), and our very own Murph, Damon Murphy, Australian 7's Rugby player.

With a central dining area, including a seating capacity of approximately 3,000 and a kitchen capable of providing 20,000 meals per day, the Athletes every whim was catered for. You name, they could eat it 24 hours a day, 7 days of the week. Athletes could receive free medical, dental, physiotherapy and optical services whilst they were in the Village. Condoms were also on mass supply!

Whether it was the memory of the Ghanaian Featherweight boxer that ate too much in his first 3 days in the Village, causing him to be overweight for Team weigh in, then having to starve himself for the next 3 days before competition to make weight, or helping the PNG team repack their bags into sports bags donated to them by the local sporting community because all their belongings arrived into Melbourne in wet cardboard boxes, or hearing of the Athletes from Sierra Leone that left the Village seeking asylum in Australia, or holding the Gold Medal of the Ghanaian weightlifter with the world's biggest grin, the memories the experience of the Commonwealth Games will live with me forever.

BROTHERS' EXPATRIATES - Italy

MARTIN FIELD-DODGSON & ZANE HILTON:

Benetton Rugby is based in a small town 30 kilometers from Venice, called Treviso. Like many of the northern towns in Italy it is a reasonably affluent town mainly due to the hard work ethic of the people from the region. Treviso itself is a walled city that is also flanked by many water ways – so many that it is generally recognized as “Little Venice”. The people are very friendly, even if you speak terrible Italian, and it is not uncommon to be invited out to lunch or dinner 3 to 4 times a week – with some dinners lasting upwards of 4 hours.

Benetton Rugby itself is sponsored by United Colors of Benetton who also are involved with the local basketball and volleyball teams, sports which are generally recognized as more famous in Italy than rugby. There have been however some very famous players play (or coach) for Benetton (or nearby clubs) including John Kirwan, Michael Lynagh, Craig Green, Gary Whetton, Zinzan Brooke, Wayne Smith (current All Blacks assistant coach), Pierre Villepreux, Alessandro Troncon and others.

Benetton Rugby has teams from its top team which play in the Italian Super 10 competition and in the European version of the Super 14, the Heineken Cup, through to an U7's team. In between there are some 12 other age grade teams who we assist in 4 broad areas.

1. Technical Assistance for the teams and the coaches. This involves working with the coaches to set out a yearly periodised plan for their team, and weekly training schedules for trainings. We also assist in running the training sessions with each of the teams.
2. Technical Resources. We are consistently in the process of designing new and improved training activities and translating them into Italian. Last season we produced a technical CD-Rom for the U7-U13 teams containing all the exercises relevant for these age groups. A very important aspect of our program is that there is continuity between the teams with respect to skill development which will inevitable assist the coaches and players in learning new skills.
3. Coaching Courses: Last year we planned out and wrote a “Benetton Rugby” specific coaching course for those coaches involved in the U7-U13 teams. This year we aim to complete a course for the U15-U19 coaches, as well as conduct short, session specific education modules for anyone at the club who wishes to attend.
4. Individual Programs: Last year we ran a “Development Squad” containing players we believe have the potential to play professionally in the next 1 to 3 years. This program operated outside of the team sessions which required an in-depth analysis of player workloads and responses to training. From this group 5 represented Italy in the U19 World Cup. We have also been involved in running individual sessions for some of the 1st team players.

One of the things that we learnt from last year is how important the basic skills of catching, passing, tackling, and contact are to developing the players and the teams. This may appear like an obvious statement

however there are clear differences between the past experiences and knowledge of players in Australia and those in the same age groups in Italy.

It was evident early on that it was vitally important to have a clear understanding of these skills from a key factor point of view simply due to the lack of coaching some players had received in these areas. The one positive to come out of this situation is that most players grasped the concepts and ideas very quickly and developed at a rate faster than we have previously been used too.

TROPHY NIGHT EXTRAVAGANSA – Crosby Park

On Saturday 9 September, Brothers Rugby Club hosted a midday Presentation lunch to acknowledge the efforts and support of our community volunteers and present the best performers in their respective positions from all teams throughout the year.

The day commenced with the inaugural Crosby “Stawell” Gift. Eight contestants, eight different distances, and the eventual winner of Bill Costello who had the best start just piping another contestant in a video finish on the line.

From outside to inside, this well supported event saw approximately 150 Brethren sit down to a day hosted by three of the club players from 2006; Anthony Andrews, Jordan Bennie, and Angus McLean. These three gentlemen had the responsibility of moving the afternoon forward going through team awards introducing and informing the meanings of the updated perpetual awards for season 2006.

Many laughs were shared in wrapping up season 2006 watching a collection of photos and video footage obtained throughout the season, finishing the night on a high with season highlights covering all divisions and teams setting a good spirit for the rest of the night.

LIFE MEMBERS & PAST PRESIDENTS LUNCH – Crosby Park

The inaugural Life Members & Past Presidents Annual Lunch was held in the Green Shed bar on Saturday, 5 August 2006 and was hosted by our current President and Life Member, Tony Shaw.

TEAM REPORTS

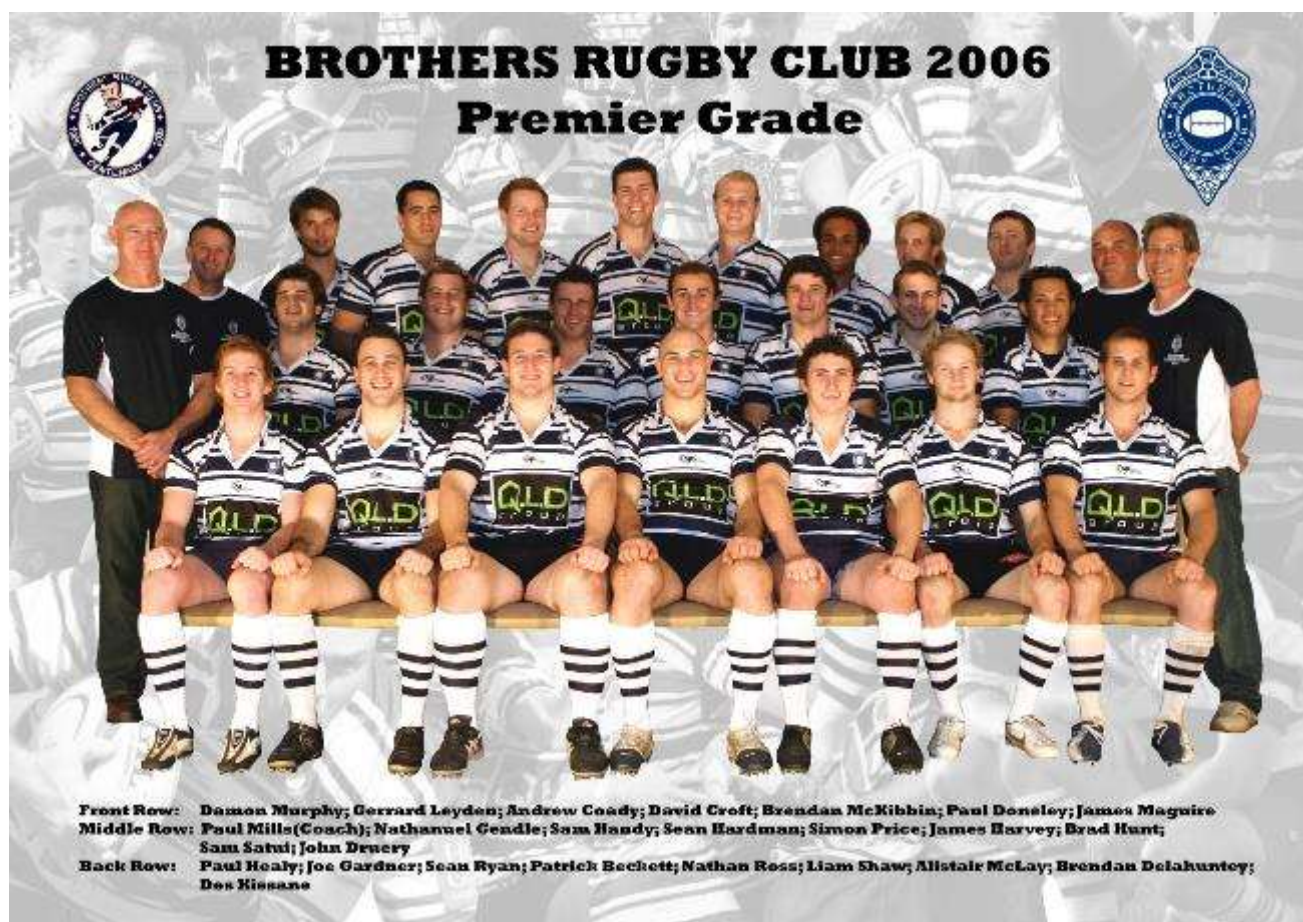

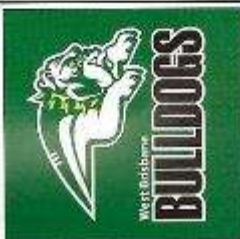
