## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

Congratulations to all who have been associated with the club in 2009. It's been a watershed year on a number of fronts, both on and off the field.

Congratulations to the Premier Grade, Division One First Grade and Third Grade on winning their Premierships.

Premier Grade enthralled us all year with their expansive high impact game. They scored a very impressive 760 points (the highest by more than 100 points) with the best defensive record, only having 347 points scored against them. In both Premiership rounds and the State Cup they scored 1000 points with 357 against.

It was a tough road to the Grand Final with a defeat to Souths in the Major Semi Final, as we tried to adjust our game to Semi Final football. We toughed it out against Easts and played magnificently in the Grand Final to claim our first Premier Grade Premiership in 22 years, beating Souths 26 to 19.

Congratulations to the Premier Grade coaches Zane Hilton, Paul Healy and Rob Murdoch, and Managers Anthony McDermott, Ron Price and John Druery on the Premiership.

Once again the spirit, determination, will to win and camaraderie at Brothers this year was exceptional.

The performance of our Premier Grade side enticed our largest crowds for some time down to Crosby Park.

Congratulations also to Zane Hilton who was named by the QRU as Coach of the Year, David Croft for winning the Alex Evans Medal for the best and fairest player, also to Brendan McKibbin for winning the Tony Shaw Medal for the best player in the Grand Final.

This year has been an exceptional year for the Club, not only because we won three Premierships, but because of the progress made on a number of fronts, much of which is documented in the General Managers Report.

The input and contribution of Zane Hilton as Rugby Manager, Mark Taylor as General Manager and Jim Frayne as our Chairman has been significant and they were all instrumental in our success this year.

This year we held a lunch at the Club before the Brothers v GPS match to celebrate Ron Price's 40 years at the Club. It was a fitting celebration of Ron and The Price family's great contribution to the Club. Congratulations Ron. Also to Simon Price who celebrated his 100<sup>th</sup> Premiership game on the day.

Particular praise to our victorious teams in Premier Grade, Reserve Grade and 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade; this dominance at the top level is exceptional indeed.

Secondly, to the volunteers who assisted throughout the year, it would be impossible to achieve what we have without your selfless efforts. You are the lifeblood of the club. To those who sat on the committee this year with Tony Shaw (President) and Jim Frayne (Chairman), thank you and congratulations on a job well done. ## **Rugby**

This year was a very good one for the club on the field. The appointment in October 2008 of Zane Hilton to the Rugby Manager/Premier Coach position has proven to be an excellent one. It was a big step for the club to commit to the expense of having both a General Manager and a Rugby Manager on a full time basis. However, Zane's skills in organising the rugby program, the player and coach education and his undoubted quality as an innovative and professional coach have been vital to the club's excellent results this year and represent a solid investment in the club's future. ## **Clubhouse**

The exciting news regarding the clubhouse is the refurbishment and reopening of the beergarden. A lot of thought and planning has gone into the project and we now have a great area that is fresh and modern that we can all be proud of. The venue will be known as "The Crossbar" and will be open to the public 7 days a week serving lunch and dinner and an enticing range of snacks and bar meals. We have also installed a new reticulation system so the beers on tap will always be icy cold. The area is designed to be family friendly and we hope that you will all take the opportunity to sample what is on offer; you won't be disappointed.

Quotes are being considered on some fairly major redecorating options for The Jacaranda Room as well. It is planned to pursue the function business quite aggressively over the next 12 months and a more comfortable and contemporary venue is needed for us to be successful.

You will also see some significant renovations taking place in and around the can bar before next season. It is intended to install toilet facilities on the hill and to improve the viewing area and the food and bar facilities as well.

## **Grounds**

The annual battle with the grounds continues, but we have made some significant headway in the last 12 months. The returfing project that we undertook at the end of last season is showing excellent dividends and there will be some major topsoil and levelling work starting in October on the top field.

The bottom field will also receive some TLC in the off-season and should be a much better surface comes next year. Steve Ferguson from Brisbane Racing is generously lending a hand with this project. This year we were able to purchase our own front deck ride-on mower thanks to a BCC grant expedited by local councillor David McLachlan. This has been a wonderful windfall for us and our grounds are better because of it. Thanks to David for his support.

## **Communication**

The new Brothers Rugby Club website is nearing completion and is looking sensational. It will provide us with a much improved tool for promoting the club and our sponsors and will also streamline communication with our members and supporters. It will be fully on line in November and the old site will divert directly to it.

## **Functions**

There were a number of great functions this year beginning with the Season Launch Breakfast which was closely followed by the launch of "Brothers in Arms" at the Rugby Club Downtown. This was a great function and thanks go to Jason "Rupert" McCall, John Eales, Chris "Buddha" Handy and Jim tucker for their efforts on the day.

Perhaps the 2 biggest functions of the year were the Style Magazine Ladies Day and the Ron Price 40 Year Lunch which was held in conjunction with the Life Members Lunch.

Ladies Day this year saw over 200 of our prettiest supporter's frock up and spend in support of the Kim Walters Choices Foundation. The Premier Grade boys wore special edition Pink jerseys donated by Canterbury Teamwear and the silent auction for them was fierce indeed. Special thanks to Tracy Johnston from Style Magazine, Lindy Taylor, Melissa Price, Renee Bidwell, Tonja Ferguson and Anthea O'Loughlin for their organising and running of the day; it was a huge success.

The last home game before the finals was the date for a special occasion. # **RUGBY MANAGER'S REPORT**

With the 2008 season finishing in August, the enthusiasm around the start of preseason was one that many had not seen for many years. This enthusiasm transferred into numbers in November with over 100 players attending the 6 weeks of preseason training prior to Christmas.

Post Christmas saw a new batch of Colts enter into the program and over the coming months as they attempted to find their feet were treated to some strong guidance by the senior players. At the end of February and prior to the commencement of the season both the Premier Grade Squad and the Premier Colts squad converged on the Sunshine Coast for Pre Season camp. With the outcomes of this camp not intended to be as much on the playing side of the club but the culture and leadership development high on the priority list; the coaching staff set out to not only test the boys physically but mentally.

With the introduction of a new competition structure in 2009, this saw a disjointed start to the season for many of the sides at the club. This was highlighted none better than Trent Jones for Premier Grade in the Grand Final against South's being called in as a late inclusion for Liam Shaw and what was for many a man of the match performance.

As the finals approached, it was clear that all grade teams would play apart in the finals and Colts 1 unfortunately missing out in the last game v GPS. So with all senior grades, Premier to 4<sup>th</sup> grade in the finals the excitement amongst the playing group was evident. It is quite simple to recognise when there is a strong culture between the playing group and it comes when witness the involvement that they have in each other's environment. From some senior players assisting lower teams and there always being a crowd to support all teams to the wave of blue and white on Grand Final day. It is this one characteristic that will remain in my mind as the trademark of 2009, Family.

As far as results go, 3 Premierships out of the top 4 senior grades was an outstanding effort by all involved. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the coaches and managers of all teams. Your tireless work does not go unnoticed. ## **SEASON EVENTS**

The official Book launch of "Brothers in Arms" on 22 May 2009, sparked stories of Brothers Rugby Club

### **WHERE do you start in recounting more than 100 years of remarkable history of Brothers rugby union club?**

It's 104 years since a group of Christian Brothers Old Boys', over a few strong drinks at the Carlton Club Hotel in Brisbane, resolved to start a rugby club.

Perhaps it is best to borrow the words of one of Brothers' most famous sons, Paul McLean, the great point scoring flyhalf who played in five grand final triumphs for the club, a century of games for Queensland and 31 Tests for the Wallabies, to capture the spirit of Brothers.

"Outside of family, I always thought Brothers was the biggest influence on my life because of all the things that flowed from it," he said. "It was the platform to play rugby for my great opportunities in sport and, with it, a gateway to the world and all the people you meet along the way.

"Brothers people are still my mates. Friendships might be stretched by lack of contact for years sometimes but they are never cut off."

McLean, a member of the famous family that produced seven internationals, recently completed a five-year tenure as Australian Rugby Union president. But he will always be a Brothers boy.

McLean was one of the famous faces at yesterday's launch of the book, *Brothers in Arms*. Written by *Courier-Mail* sports writer Jim Tucker, the book documents the long, proud and colourful history of Brothers Rugby Club. "It recognises the life and soul of the club as well as the premierships," said Tucker.

John Eales, who was accompanied by his mother Rosa yesterday, said he felt "unworthy" as he officially launched the book. "I feel unworthy because so many people have contributed more to the club than I have," he said. "I can't overstate what Brothers did for me. I started in 1986 with an under-16 team and joined because my dad Jack taught Brendan Moon at Marist Ashgrove and he went to Brothers." Eales, who achieved legendary status in the game, had completed his second season in the top grade with Brothers when a famous story was spawned.

When Eales arrived for the traditional Mad Monday pub crawl, he was carrying a lunchbox lovingly prepared by mum Rosa. Not surprisingly, the yarn was revived at yesterday's function. Another face in the crowd was former player Jack Buchanan, now in his 80s, who travelled from Sydney. When Brothers were granted their current ground at Crosby Park in 1951, Jack was a young surveyor who used his skill and equipment to mark the boundaries and location of the famous "old green shed" that became part of Brothers folklore.

Inter-woven with the rich tapestry of on-field deeds are a multitude of rich anecdotes. Stories of stalwarts like Joe French who played for Queensland at 21, coached the first of five premiership sides at 31 and was tackling major issues in the game as a leading administrator into his 70s. When Joe passed on, his ashes were scattered beneath the goalposts at the hill end of his beloved Ballymore. Over the years there has been triumph, drama, crisis and a smidgen of infamy. In 1988 the Fitzgerald inquiry heard evidence that infamous bagman Jack Herbert used the car park at Crosby Park as a rendezvous for handing over money to a senior police officer.

Rousing dressing room oratory espoused by former coach Jim Kenny still resonates with ex-players, including former Wallaby prop Chris Handy who recalled game-day gatherings at the coach's home. "We'd have steak with potatoes dripping with butter. That was the carbo-overload," said Handy. "Our team masseur Vern Honan would give us a haircut and he'd also be let loose to give us a jab with a battery-driven cattle prod." Kenny, a plumber, produced the classic quote aimed at NSW coach Dave Brockhoff: "He couldn't coach a choko vine over a dunny door."

Handy started with Brothers in 1969 and never envisaged where rugby would take him. "I never realised I was going to have so much fun. It was a journey I wasn't prepared for," he said. "One of the great pleasures after playing for your state or country was to come back and turn out for Brothers next day. It was expected."

Acclaimed singer-songwriter Pete Murray played on the wing for Brothers in the 1990s and earned selection in the Queensland Under-21 side. Murray was a popular impromptu post-match performer at the club years before he hit international stardom with sellout concerts in London, Amsterdam and Dublin.

Tony Shaw, the inspirational hardman for Brothers, Queensland and the Wallabies through the 1970s and early '80s, is in his fourth year as president of the club. In the 1982 grand final against University, Shaw sustained a broken jaw and played out the game just as rugby league's John Sattler did for South Sydney. Away from the fire and brimstone of yesteryear, Shaw flips burgers on the barbecue at home games and entertains sponsors. "I had 15 years away from Brisbane, but I've come back to pay my dues," he said. "It's an amateur club and everyone has to do their bit. "I'm very proud and honoured to be president of Brothers."

As yesterday's gathering dispersed, John Eales had the last word. "I've lived in Sydney about eight years and the thing I miss most about Brisbane is going down to Brothers and sitting on the hill with blokes you played with, or fellows from other generations. "It makes me proud to say I'm a Brothers man."



## **Renamed Perpetual Trophy for Brothers Rugby Club**

### **F. McDonnell & J.E. Ross M.B.E. Memorial Trophy**

Awarded to the best performed team

With the success of the Club's Launch of our Centenary Book it was decided that it was the perfect time to rename "The President's Trophy" in honour of two of our longest serving Past President's;

**Frank McDonnell M.L.C.** was an Old Boy of Christian Brothers School, Ennis County Clare, and was one of the founding members of both the Christian Brothers Old Boys Association (1899) and Christian Brothers Football Club (1905).

Frank owned & operated McDonnell & East Department Store and served his community as a Member of both Houses of Queensland's Parliament for 27 years and served the Brothers Club with distinction as our President for 18 years (1905-22).

The Christian Brothers Old Boys Association also established the Frank McDonnell Medal in his honour for student with the Highest State Scholarship Pass from a Catholic School.

**Jack Ross M.B.E.** was an Old Boy of St. Joseph's Nudgee College and later served on the Staff of the College. Jack was instrumental in the Revival of the Rugby Code in Queensland in 1928 after a decade of the Code ceasing to exist. ## CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

I look back at my Club Captain's Report and note the first sentence states "*The season of 2008 yielded great success, both on and off the field, and certainly entered as one of the most successful seasons in recent memory*". I now get the opportunity to say the same thing and can do so with more specificity.

Season 2009 was without a doubt the most successful season Brothers Rugby Club has experienced, on the field in the last 30 years. Once again, boasting considerable depth, Brothers took the field with no fewer than 10 teams playing on Friday evenings and Saturdays. Of those 10 teams to take the field in the butcher's stripe this year, five progressed to a Semi-Final, be it minor and major, and of those five teams, three would ultimately play in the Grand Final and win.

We are fortunate once more, that as a Club we see very few retirements and across the board the playing group would appear to be playing stronger with an influx of Colts anticipated in 2010 on top of those already seasoned by the 2009 experience. The depth of the club continues to grow both in forwards and backs and that is certainly evidenced in Division 1 2<sup>ND</sup> Grade that had a forward pack which consisted largely of last year's Colts progress all the way through to the Preliminary Final.

Certainly, the reason for the clubs success was the way in which all players embrace the culture of Brothers and apply themselves to the training regimes given to them. The effort shown by everyone was nothing short of spectacular from the first session at the end of 2008 through to the early hours of the morning on Monday, 22 October 2009. We can only hope that next year's "filth" can apply themselves with such dedication.

# TEAM REPORTS

## ***Premier Grade – PREMIERS, MINOR PREMIERS & STATE CHAMPIONS***

After an early finish to the 2008 season, the Club started pre-season training in October 2008 ready for a big year full of promise. The initial Premier squad of 35 players was put together in preparation for the inaugural QRU State Cup which commenced in February 2009.

The first hit-out was against Cairns with three players making their Premier Grade debut for the Club; Brett Gillespie, Nicholas Winkler and Georgdie Asprey. Brett joined Brothers from University and revelled in his new surroundings. Brothers would win the first match at Crosby Park by 69-0. The following weekend at Crosby, Brothers took on the Rockhampton Brahms and had a very convincing win by 98 point to 3.

The bye weekend in the State Cup allowed the Premier Squad to head to Currimundi Active Recreation Centre on the Sunshine coast for a weekend of hard training, team building and socialising. The Premier Colts also participated in the weekend and allowed the players and coaching staff to further develop their football talents and social skills. The bhoys particularly enjoyed the 1am beach run and DIY session.

The final round of the State Cup saw Brothers head to Townsville for the day on a hit and run mission. Unfortunately the timing of the fixture didn't allow the playing group to stay overnight and enjoy some northern hospitality. Although we won the game 71-7, the score doesn't quite tell the whole story about the toughness of the exchanges. I would also like to thank the Townsville Brothers bhoys; Terry and Brian Fanning for their assistance on the day.

The State Cup competition and Pre-season camp saw the Premier Squad head into the first round on the Hospital Cup Premiership full of confidence. The first couple of games against the Sunshine Coast and Sunnybank were highlighted with easy wins and large results. The Round 4 match against Wests at Sylvan Rd was for the season's first piece of silverware the Pilecki-Shaw Cup, which resulted in a 62-5 win to Brothers. The juggernaut rolled on with a 38-15 win over arch-rivals, University to claim the Templeton-McLean Cup.

With more good results against Easts and Souths, the team were primed for a tough away game against the Gold Coast. The match started badly with a season ending injury to half back Tom Collins. This saw Samuel Grasso make his Premier Grade debut, but unfortunately the game was lost by 22-5.

During the first round the depth of the club was surely tested with a number of players being unavailable for selection. Sean Hardman, Brendan McKibbin, Anthony Sauer, Andrew Shaw were all involved in the Queensland Red's Super 14 campaign with Brendan McKibbin and Andrew Shaw making their debuts for the State. Brothers' stalwarts Sean Hardman captained Queensland for the first time and Anthony Sauer was recalled after 3 seasons playing club football. There was also Brothers international representatives with Andrew Shaw gaining selection in the Australian U20 for the World Championships in Japan and both Damon Murphy and Dominic Shipperley representing Australia in the 7's programme.

The start of the second round Hospital Cup Premiership saw Andrew Coady play his 100<sup>th</sup> Premier Grade game against the Sunshine Coast at Stockland Park in Round 12. The game also saw young colt, Dominic Shipperley make his Premier Grade debut and the result was an emphatic win by 32-13. The return match for the Pilecki-Shaw Cup at Crosby Park in Round 15 saw the Brothers machine clock up another big win by 58-5.

The Round 16 match against University would be the biggest weekend of the year so far. It would be the return fixture of the Templeton-McLean Cup, Old Bhoys' Day and a celebration of 100 premier games for celebrated warhorse David Croft. The game was a torrid exchange with the Red Heavies trying their hardest to spoil the Club's celebration. The Bhoys would win the match by the closest of margins by 36-35.

The next weekend would be a contest for the inaugural QRU State Cup. The final would be played between the winner of the Northern Conference, Brothers and the winner of the Southern Conference, Easts. It was the first meeting in a final between these two teams since the 2008 Grand Final. Brothers were dominant in all facets of the game all over the park and easily beat Easts at Bottomley Park by 23-12.

The good form of Brothers throughout the season saw a number of its members selected in a Queensland XV to play a mid week match against the touring Japanese side. Sean Hardman, Anthony Sauer, Liam Shaw, Dallan Murphy and Dominic Shipperley were all selected in the team and performed very well and got good game time.

The home game against the Gold Coast Breakers in Round 20 saw the Thomas Welsby Memorial Cup up for grabs. The match also saw the Premier Grade players turn out in pink and navy butcher stripes to support the Kim Walters Choices programme and continue Brothers strong involvement in charity fundraisers. The Welsby Cup is played between the top two teams at the end of the first round and Brother went on to win the match 39-27 and claim their 20<sup>th</sup> Welsby Cup, the most by any club since the Cup's inception in 1934.

With an out of character loss to Norths the previous week Brother were keen to regain their attacking rhythm and work on their game plan moving into the finals series. The final game against GPS at Crosby Park also saw the Keith Horsley Memorial Trophy for the Minor Premiership up for grabs. The game also had the extra significance that it was Simon Price's 100<sup>th</sup> Premier Grade game and club legend Ron Price was celebrating his 40 year association with the club with a Testimonial Lunch prior to the kick-off. The game was pretty to watch and with their attacking flair back the bhoys put GPS to the sword and went out winners by 52-5.

The Major Semi-final against Souths would be a tough game after our last up loss to them only four previously. The game was hard fought but unfortunately we didn't play our best on the day and went down to the Maggies 29-20. The loss meant we would face Easts in the Preliminary Final and hopefully put an end to their dreams of back to back premierships. Brothers dominated all facets of the game and were the much better team on the day. The win by 22-10 meant we would get another crack at Souths and a chance for redemption.

The week leading into the Grand Final was disrupted by the loss of influential players Liam Shaw and Damon Murphy due to injury. However, it just meant that the members of the Grand Final team would have to pull together and ensure that they get the job done. The match also saw Anthony Pyers run on for his 100<sup>th</sup> premier grade game and become the 4<sup>th</sup> Brothers player this season to reach the milestone.

Souths welcomed back Quade Cooper into their line up but Brothers weren't concerned and were happy to play the full strength Souths team. Brothers scored early and the nerves were settled, you just knew they were never going to lose this game. Brothers were always in control, a small loss of concentration gave Souths a sniff, but Bothers were always one step ahead.

With the final whistle came a surging "blue and white" wave of humanity and thousands of Brothers' long suffering supporters ran onto Ballymore and engulfed the players in a sea of emotion. Sean Hardman, who suffered a broken arm in the last 90 seconds of the game, waved off the medical staff to ensure that he stayed on the field and in the moment. Players, Coaches, Managers and Supporters celebrated the 26-19 victory and the Club's first Hospital Cup win since 1987.

The Hospital Cup triumph was a fitting end to a magnificent playing career for former Wallaby and Queensland flanker David Croft, who announced his retirement. The victory was also a fitting reward for captain, Brendan McKibbin, who will move to Sydney next season to take up a Super 14 contract with New South Wales.

The QRU's inaugural "Festival of Rugby", saw Brothers players; Simon Price, Dan Kilmartin, Dallan Murphy, Anthony Pyers and Zane Hilton (Coach) rewarded with selection in the Brisbane XV to play Queensland Country. After this match the QRU held its Annual Awards Dinner and a number of Brothers members were recognised.

Among the winners were David Croft (Alec Evans Medal), Zane Hilton (Coach of the Year), Paul Doneley (Queensland Premier Rugby - Leading try scorer) and Brendan McKibbin (Tony Shaw Medal).

The Premier Grade squad had made history; the group of 39 players who had been a part of this year's success had managed to sweep all before them by claiming six trophies. This group could arguably be seen as the most successful team since 1949. The Club on the whole had also had its most successful year since 1983, which coincidentally Brothers also won the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> premierships.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Zane for allowing me to be the Manager of this year's Premier Grade team; it's been an absolute pleasure.

To Zane Hilton, Paul Healy, Rob Murdoch, Ron Price, John Druery, Jim Maguire and Ian Astbury, thanks for your patience, assistance, feed-back and humorous anecdotes throughout the year.

To the Players, thanks for your help, camaraderie, good humour, positive feed-back and assistance in making this season a most enjoyable one. I hope you take time to enjoy the fruits of your labour and look back with a sense of pride on your place in the Club's history as members of Brothers 27<sup>th</sup> Premiership winning team.




The Directors of the Club have pleasure in submitting the Balance Sheet and Profit and Profit and Loss Accounts for the Financial Year ended 30 June 2009.

**NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES.**

The principal accounting policies adopted by Brothers Rugby Club Inc ( herein referred to as the Club), are stated in order to assist in a general understanding of the Financial Statements. These policies have been consistently applied except as otherwise indicated.

The Club is not a reporting entity because, in the opinion of the Directors of the Club, there are unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports so tailored as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These accounts are therefore Special Purpose Financial Reports that have been prepared solely to meet the requirements to prepare accounts under the Club's Constitution.

No other Accounting Standards have mandatory applicability.

The accounts have been prepared on a historical basis, and do not take into account changing money values except where buildings have been revalued.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the accounts.

**Property, Plant & Equipment.**

Property, Plant and equipment are included at cost except where Buildings and other assets have been revalued. These assets are written off as an expense over their estimated economic useful life

The rate determined is 1% ( Straight Line Method ) for buildings and fixtures, 10% ( Straight Line Method ) for office and kitchen improvements and various rates as required for plant & equipment.

 Brothers Colts Rugby Club was set up in 1994 to operate in-house bingo sessions. Under current legislation, the Club is not permitted to hold bingo activities whilst owning bingo sessions in other organisations such as Southside Bingo. This asset has now been scrapped and the debt from the Colts has been written off.

**Note 5 – INVESTMENT.**

Units in S'Side Bingo Unit Trust – at cost 16800 16800  
 During 1994, a Property Unit Trust was established by the holders of sessions at Southside Bingo to enable purchase of property from which bingo is conducted. This Club purchased one unit to ensure it's continued participation in bingo sessions. The unit is worth substantially more based on further property acquisitions and valuations recently undertaken by Southside Unit Trust.




### *Property, Plant and Equipment*


