PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have read the last two Presidents reports and general managers reports as a preliminary to writing this my first Presidents Report and I would have to say a lot can happen in the space of twelve months.

This year has been successful from an on-field perspective because Premier Grade took out the Australian Club Championship and because of the number of teams that contested finals, and in particular because of the success of the Colts. We did not achieve the highest honour with any team and that was unfortunate as Grand Finals are usually a measure of success. We did have six teams contest finals which could have lead to higher honours with a little luck but that was not to be. I believe there are valid contributing factors, for the results for the year, but to go into them feels like excuses and that does not achieve anything.

Instead I would like to dwell for a moment on the success of the Colts and the Rugby Development Program. The objective of the committee in appointing Zane Hilton was to improve the overall performance of the Club on the field and to attract more Colts to ensure the teams of the future were competitive and successful.

We were able to field three Colts teams all year and two of them made the finals. We were able to introduce five players to Premier Grade who were eligible for Colts this year. Most players will continue with the Club for 2011 and that will contribute to the realisation of the objectives of the Rugby Development Program.

Zane's commitment to that Program, which is paramount for its continued success, is unquestioned and with that commitment he brings a knowledge and style that is true professionalism. Assisting him in the development of the culture that is Brothers Rugby Club is Tom Collins as Club Captain. Tom and his leadership team, who have done remarkably well, are to be congratulated on what is often a thankless task.

The reports of 2009 hinted that we would have a very successful financial year this year but unfortunately that has not been the case. The financial report to be delivered by Des Hogan discloses a loss that is troubling and the extra revenue foreshadowed as necessary by Anthony Shaw as president in 2008 has not been achieved. In fact with losses from the Crossbar, reduction of the QRU grant and a failure to gain significant increased sponsorship the Club has financially lost ground that we must now make up. To ignore the adverse impact of the financial situation that we report on would be terminal so I will dwell on the situation and the actions put in place to correct the financial position.

Several decisions were taken over the last two years with the advancement of the Club as the objective. Two full-time employees were engaged to improve on-field performance and off-field efficiency and revenue generation; the Crossbar was opened, with the assistance of Peter Lavin but also with significant expenditure by the Club, for the purpose of providing a pleasant area for members and to generate revenue; and we published the History of the Club, commissioned several years previously, at not inconsiderable expense. All of these decisions have been financially unsuccessful and whereas I doubt anyone would brand them inappropriate action was imperative to correct the consequences.

We fortuitously received an offer to lease the Crossbar and after negotiation we are satisfied that that arrangement will be significantly financially beneficial for the Club.

Mark Taylor offered to resign and that offer was accepted. I thank Mark for the years he spent with the Club and the effort he made to attempt to ensure the Clubs future. Unfortunately in this environment, and structure for Community Rugby, it is not feasible to operate with two full-time managers, a lesson that is now well learned.

Tonight and over the next few days I will launch a major effort to recoup the outlaid publishing costs of the History of Brothers Rugby Club by selling the remaining copies of the limited edition book.

The revenue increase that we required during 2010, from an increase in sponsors, was commenced too late to be as successful as possible and was poorly managed. The committee has already commenced the search for sponsors for 2011 with interviews with major sponsors and the production of a tender document for the platinum sponsor, Imagetec. That search will continue unrelentingly until the revenue we need to run the Club is achieved.

We owe a debt of gratitude to sponsors who support the revenue of the Club with doubtful value for the amount they expend. This year we are concentrating of increasing value, particularly for those sponsors from the corporate world.

I feel quite confident that the actions taken, with some urgency this year, will restore our financial position over time and allow us to reap the benefits of a successful Rugby Development Program, in premierships, and maybe even the Doughty Shield, and will return the Green Shed Bar to the players, as a Club Bar, for their enjoyment and that of our loyal supporters.

I have to thank my committee and in particular Vice- President Paul French for their support and effort during the year. I am particularly thankful that Gerard Jefferies is so confident of his full recovery that he has nominated for another term.

I also offer Tony Shaw congratulations and best wishes for his election to the position of President of the QRU and thank him for the years he has dedicated to Brothers as a player coach and administrator and lastly as President of the Club. The challenge is for me to walk in his shoes and so far that has not been easy, hopefully it will improve.

Queensland 2009 Premiers Brothers held off a late charge by 2009 Shute Shield winners Sydney University to win an exciting Australian Club Championship challenge 36-26 at Crosby Park in Brisbane today.

Given the responsibility of defending the title won by Easts over Sydney University in the equivalent fixture in Sydney last year, Brothers rose to the challenge and scored five tries to three in a fast, open game enjoyed by the large crowd at Brothers' home ground.

Brothers led 12-9 at halftime and looked like they would run away with the match at 26-14, but University came charging back to trail 29-26 and had all the momentum with five minutes to play, until a Brothers try to centre Nathaniel Gendle sealed the match for the home side.

Both teams were a shadow of the sides that won their respective Premier competitions due to retirements, representative commitments and pre-season rustiness, but they showed enough skill and speed under the new law interpretations to send warning signals to the other teams in their respective competitions.

"The new interpretations play right into our hands, we want to use the football, we want to play with width," said Brothers coach Zane Hilton.

"The same with University, they played some outstanding footy when they got quick ball."



Brian Frederick “Tich” Reid – 8th July 2010

Brothers are mourning the loss of club stalwart Brian “Tich” Reid, who passed away on 8th July. “Tich” played his first club game as a fresh-faced lad from St Columban’s in the late 1940’s, the start of a lifetime of devotion extending well over 30 years.

He played just a handful of times in the top grade but over 200 games in the lower grades before becoming a coach of Under-18, Under-19 and lower grade sides.

“Tich” guided the club’s first Under-19 premiership side in 1964 and was made a life member in 1967 even before coaching up another wave of youngsters during a hat-trick of Under-18 titles (1971-72-73).

“Tich” passed away peacefully on Thursday 8th July 2010. A service in celebration of Brian’s life was held in the Pinnaroo Chapel, Graham Road, Bridgeman Downs on Wednesday 14th July, 2010 and was followed by burial in the Pinnaroo Lawn Cemetery.

Jeffrey James McLean – 6th August 2010

Former Brothers, Queensland and Wallaby winger Jeff McLean died at the age of 62 after a prolonged battle with cancer.

Jeffrey James McLean was a member of one of Australia’s most distinguished rugby families, with a Queensland and Wallaby pedigree stretching back to 1899. He represented Queensland from 1969 to 1974 and played 13 Tests for Australia between 1971 and 1974, before a badly broken leg suffered during a match in Rockhampton between Brisbane and Queensland Country brought a premature end to his career.

He joined Brothers Rugby club after distinguishing himself in a number of sports while attending St Mary’s College which later became St Edmund’s College at Ipswich and went on to play a key role in Queensland Rugby’s rise to power in the 1970s.

A Requiem Mass will be held at St Mary’s Catholic Church, Ipswich, on Wednesday, 11th August.

Bernard Joseph Lewis – 16th August 2010

Brothers Rugby Club has announced the passing of former player Bernie Lewis at the age of 88. Mr Lewis’s son Peter also played for Brothers and Queensland and went on to become Chairman of the QRU.

Bernie Lewis played for Brothers during the 1940’s and became famous for his rarely repeated five try performance against New Farm at the Exhibition Ground in 1946. The nickname “Five Try” stuck with him throughout his life.

He enjoyed a successful career as an architect and during the 1970’s designed the Brothers Club House at Crosby Park as well as “The McLean Stand” at Ballymore.

His funeral was held on Friday August 20th at 11 am at Holy Spirit Catholic Church, Villiers Street, New Farm.

Obstacles tackled with gusto

WALLABY Jeff McLean was doing what he did best - flying down the wing in a rugby union game at Rockhampton in 1974.

McLean, centre-kicked, but was tackled by an opponent and fell awkwardly. He leg broke in five places and he was hospitalised for months, ending what was one of Australian rugby's glittering careers.

His sporting prowess was nothing surprising as his family was one of rugby's most distinguished, producing seven Wallabies and a string of other top players.

He represented Queensland in 40 games from 1969 to 1974 and played 13 Tests for Australia, making his debut against South Africa at the Brisbane Exhibition Ground in 1971.

The older brother of former Wallaby and Queensland captain Paul McLean, Jeff McLean played his last Test in the same match that Paul made his debut (against New Zealand in 1974).

It would have been easy for McLean to have withdrawn into himself after the sudden end to his sporting career, but instead he attacked life after football the way he had played the

Mayne Harriers Athletics Club. A noted try scorer and goal kicker, he racked up 350 points for West End and played Bulimba Cup football for Ipswich before switching to rugby union (something virtually unheard of at the time) in 1969.

It proved an inspired move, as he joined the Brothers rugby union club and was quickly elevated into the Queensland side in 1970, a year before making his Test debut.

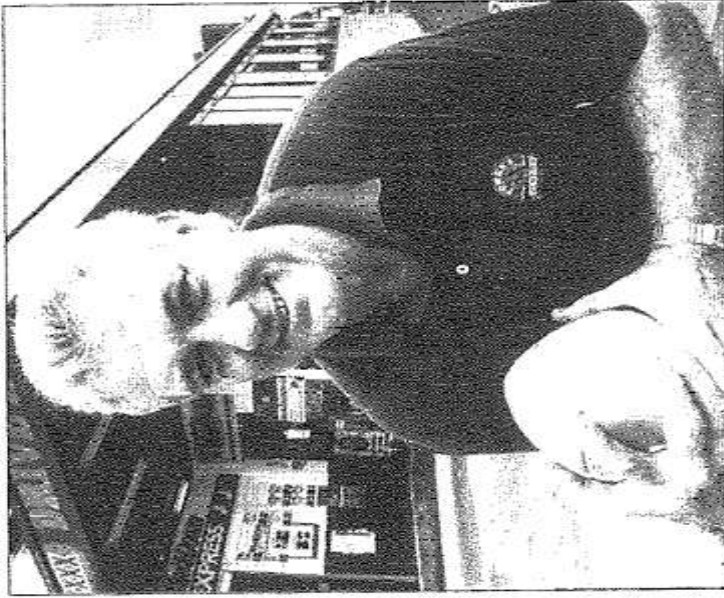
He was soon regarded as one of the world's best players, a point rammed home during Australia's ill-fated Wallaby tour to New Zealand in 1972.

McLean was one of the few Australian players - the side was nicknamed the "Woeful Wallabies" - to emerge from the tour with his head held high.

So well did he play that he was named in the New Zealand Rugby Almanac as one of the five players of the year.

He was later named in Brothers' Team of the Century and was awarded the St Edmund's Old Boys Medal in 2009 for his achievements.

While he concentrated on playing rugby union, McLean also competed in athletics and

was a member of Queensland's 4x100m relay at the national titles where he clocked a slashing 10.4 seconds.

It earned him a place in the Commonwealth Games trials, but his football took priority.

The McLean family have lived in the Ipswich area for 150 years and although he often had offers to move elsewhere, McLean rarely strayed far from the coal city.

He was patron of the Ipswich Rangers Rugby Union Club for 20 years and joined the Ipswich

Turf Club. In the late 1980s the ITC was close to collapse and it was apparent something urgent needed to be done.

McLean and his mates got on the committee and worked tirelessly until the ITC attained its current status as one of the strongest clubs in Australia.

He also threw himself into his work as a publican, and his hotel was a regular spot for Ipswich's sporting circles and visiting Brisbane folk.

About three years ago, McLean was diagnosed with throat cancer.

Typically, he fought the disease to the end.

Although desperately ill, he made it to this year's Ipswich Cup meeting and the McLean family reunion.

Tributes have poured in from around the rugby world. QRU president Tony Shaw described McLean as "amazingly talented".

"He would undoubtedly have gone on to an even more highly decorated career had he not badly broken his leg," Shaw said.

McLean is survived by his wife Carmel, son David and daughter Bridget.

Architect of local landmarks

**Bernard Joseph
'Fuff' Lewis**

**RAAF bombardier,
PoW, architect,
rugby fan**

Born: June 9, 1922,
Hobart

Died: August 16, 2010,
Brisbane

SOME of the most famous of Brisbane's architectural icons owe their genesis to Bernie 'Fuff' Lewis.

He survived the perils of serving as a navigator/bombardier in World War II, including being shot down and becoming a prisoner of war, to become an architect who could name the original Kingsford Smith Memorial, Festival Hall, Ballymore and the Channel 9 studios at Mount Coot-tha among his many projects.

He was also a rugby tragic and loved nothing more than chatting about the game.

Born in Hobart, he moved to Murwillumbah and then to

Brisbane as a child, where he went to Nudgee College.

It was the start of a lifelong affection for the school, and the Christian Brothers who taught him, as he was an only child without a father and a very unconventional mother. Nudgee provided him his true family at that time.

But war broke out by the end of his school years and in 1941 he joined the RAAF as a navigator/bombardier. He

sailed for England to further his training, and then Scotland, before beginning night bombing raids over Germany.

In 1942 his squadron was transferred to the North Africa campaign. With about 20 missions under his belt, he flew on a raid over Naples in a Wellington bomber in July 1943.

It was a success but the plane was shot down on the way home and ditched off Sicily.

The crew drifted in a life raft for nearly two days before being captured by an Italian ship. So began a two-year ordeal as a prisoner of war, during which he was marched from the toe of Italy north through Austria, Germany, and Poland to Lithuania, then back to Germany - more than 1600km.

He escaped three times, once jumping from the roof of a moving troop train under machinegun fire but was recaptured before one day the guards disappeared. The war was over.

A lengthy, adventurous route saw him back home in Brisbane, where he immediately enrolled in an architecture degree, fulfilling a lifelong ambition.

He started work with Jack Donoghue, a prominent local

architect, studying at night. On weekends he played for Brothers, which won the premiership in 1946 (he managed to score five tries in one match, a club record not broken until the 1960s).

It was during this period that he had the biggest break of his life - meeting, courting and marrying Moya Weller, from the prominent Queensland family of publicans. It was a fitting match as nobody loved a cold XXXX more than Mr Lewis.

After a very glamorous society wedding they settled into married life and soon had two children.

Once Mr Lewis finished his degree, in 1951, he and friend George Williams established their own practice, Lewis Williams Architects.

Over the coming four decades Mr Lewis designed many fine buildings including about 20 hotels around the state.

The family home at St Lucia was another of his beautiful designs, as well as their beach house on the Sunshine Coast.

His last major project was the Morayfield Tavern. The client was his son, and the managers were the Weller family.

For someone whose passion was rugby, and who had proudly supported four teams - Nudgee, Brothers, Queensland and the Wallabies - two projects stood out as favourites.

The first was Ballymore, which Mr Lewis helped get built in the 1960s. He was later rewarded with the No.1 life membership of the QRU Club.

The second was the Brothers clubhouse. He was made a life member of it, too, in the 1980s.

His conversation was always laced with rugby analogies and he was happiest at the footy.

One of his proudest days came when his grandson Joe won a premiership in the 1997 Nudgee 1st XV, completing a family trifecta of GPS premiership starting with Mr Lewis's old Nudgee team in 1940 and his son Peter's side in 1968.

In 1993 he woke up speaking German (a relic of his days as a PoW) after suffering a stroke. It ended his career.

Mr Lewis's wife predeceased him. He is survived by his children Peter and Barbara, Peter's children Joe, Tilly, Toby and Hannah, Barbara's children Dominique, Ophie, Georgina and Annabel, and five great grandchildren.

Premier Grade – AUSTRALIAN CLUB CHAMPIONS & SEMI-FINALISTS

NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES.

The principal accounting policies adopted by Brothers Rugby Club Inc (herein referred to as the Club), are stated in order to assist in a general understanding of the Financial Statements. These policies have been consistently applied except as otherwise indicated.

The Club is not a reporting entity because, in the opinion of the Directors of the Club, there are unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports so tailored as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These accounts are therefore Special Purpose Financial Reports that have been prepared solely to meet the requirements to prepare accounts under the Club's Constitution.

No other Accounting Standards have mandatory applicability.

The accounts have been prepared on a historical basis, and do not take into account changing money values except where buildings have been revalued.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the accounts.

Property, Plant & Equipment.

Property, Plant and equipment are included at cost except where Buildings and other assets have been revalued. These assets are written off as an expense over their estimated economic useful life

The rate determined is 1% (Straight Line Method) for buildings and fixtures, 10% (Straight Line Method) for office and kitchen improvements and various rates as required for plant & equipment.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement, being a special purpose financial report, of Brothers Rugby Club Inc. for the 12 (twelve) months ended 30 June 2010 as set out on pages 2 to 7 in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

The Club's Committee of Management are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement and the information contained therein and have determined that the basis of accounting used and described in Note 1 to the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 and the needs of the Club. We have conducted an independent audit of the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement in order to express an opinion to the members of Brothers Rugby Club Inc. on their preparation and presentation. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, and described, in Note 1, are appropriate to the needs of the members.

Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement are presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement. Qualifications

Income

Property, Plant and Equipment

All property assets of the Club are constructed on Brisbane City Council land over which the club holds a sporting lease. This lease is due to expire on 6 October 2012. The property assets are not an asset for which a commercial sale price can be established.

Under these circumstances, there is a significant uncertainty that the property, plant and equipment are recorded in excess of their recoverable amount. We are unable to assess the amount by which the carrying amount may or may not exceed the recoverable amount.

Qualified Audit Opinion

In our opinion, subject to the qualifications noted above the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement of Brothers Rugby Club Inc. for the 12 (twelve) months ended 30 June 2009 are properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs as at 30 June 2010 and of the deficit for the 12 (twelve) month period ended on that date.
