

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2025 was another great year on the field for Brothers. We competed in all Grade premierships and Colts 2, 3 and 4, winning four out of eight. Unfortunately, we fell just short of the three-peat in Premier Grade, but it was a great performance and ironically a bit of a reversal of the result of the previous 2 years where we scored late.

I would like to thank and congratulate all of our players and coaches and managers in the successes this year. You are the lifeblood of our club. I hope that like so many who have gone before you, that you get much more out of the club than just wins on the field.

Our women's team started the year well but unfortunately missed out in the finals. I would like to thank all of our women players for their enthusiastic involvement at the club during the year. Here's hoping season 2026 is even better.

Our juniors and touch programs also had strong years. We trialled a new junior competition with Easts and GPS in under 6's to under 9's and this look set to continue next year. We also continue to grow our touch offering, and thank you to all our touch players.

I would like to thank all our sponsors and volunteers for supporting the club again during the year. Without you our club could not continue and we greatly appreciate your support in whatever capacity it is able to be provided.

During the year there have been some changes in the rugby department. JP was appointed head of rugby late last year and he has done a great job in assisting our junior and senior squads. He has been heavily involved in Colts recruitment for season 2026 so watch this space there.

On the club's redevelopment, as announced in November, we have appointed Rohrig Constructions to finalise the design for the new change sheds that will be built next year. The club will select an appropriate builder once the designs are finalised in the new year. This construction will not impact our home games next year. Further detail on the final design will be released when it is available.

Our club restaurant, Crosbys, re-opened at the start of the year with Queensland Cricketers Club appointed the club's food and beverage partner in late 2024. I would encourage all members to support this venue and sample its fare over the coming year.

I am pleased to be able to report a small cash profit for the 2025 year. The last 2 years from a financial standpoint have been challenging ones for our club as I understand has been the case for the vast majority of local community sporting clubs given the extreme weather events earlier in the year and the continual increase in costs to run a business. We have had to make some tough decisions to ensure we operate the club sustainably and we are happy that this has resulted in a modest cash profit.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

As part of my Presidents Report I would also like to present the audited Financial Statements for the Club for the financial year ended 31 October 2025.

In summary, the result for the financial year was a Profit of \$241,882 [2024: Loss of \$26,285].

Throughout the year the Club received significant commitments and financial support from Government for the Club's Master Plan.

As part of the Qld Government's election commitments, the Club was awarded a \$6m grant for our Master Plan by the Department of Sport, Racing and Olympic and Paralympic Games and have been afforded the first Milestone payment of \$2.85m. This along with the \$250,000 received from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development, stands the Club in good stead for our new facility with the process underway for finalising the construction design.

Southside Sport & Community Club continues to support our Club with donations and distributions netting \$114,000 during the year [\*\$64,000 non-cash\*].

We were also highly successful with our annual events, the two most significant being the Rugby Test Lunch and Corporate Golf Day. Both events were more profitable in 2025 than years previous, with the Test Lunch yielding a net profit of \$60,000 and the Golf Day \$38,000.

Unfortunately our senior 'home game' events suffered considerably this year with wet weather affecting 8 out 9 home games which resulted in a decline in revenue taken at the Can Bar by \$34,000 compared to Budget.

The Club unfortunately also saw a significant variance in sponsorship revenue this year due to the loss of a major sponsor however, the 2026 Sponsorship pipeline is very solid with a number of sponsors re-signing and actually increasing their financial support for next year and beyond.

2025 also saw the commencement of a new partnership with Queensland Cricketers Club, who now service the Club's hospitality outlets. This partnership is evolving and we look forward to an even more successful 2026!

Finally I would sincerely like to thank the two Treasurers who worked tirelessly throughout the year, both Simon Neill and Graeme Linklater (Acting), it is truly appreciated and the Club indebted for your efforts.

## DIRECTOR OF RUGBY

The 2025 season reaffirmed Brothers Rugby Club as a high-performing and culturally grounded organisation with strong pathways, genuine community connection and competitive success. Across junior and senior rugby, our focus remained on player development, club culture and delivering experiences that extend beyond the field.

In the Senior Program, eight teams reached Grand Finals, resulting in four premierships (Colts 2, Colts 3, 2nd Grade and 4th Grade). Our Women's Premier team claimed the Aiken-Kairl Cup for the first time, defeating UQ away. Recruitment of *Jude Gibbs* (Sydney) and *David Fusitu'a* (former NRL Kiwi/Tonga) elevated standards and brought strong cultural leadership. Rugby 7s performances improved, with the Women finishing 5th in the Caslick Cup and the Men 6th in the Stannard Cup.

Our First Grade and lower grade teams also retained an outstanding collection of challenge trophies throughout the QPR competition, including:

- **Keith Horsley Memorial Trophy, Thomas Welsby Cup, Templeton–McLean Cup, Flynn–Lewis Memorial Shield, Bola–Kefu Memorial Shield and the Eales–Wilson Shield**
- **B.G. "Chappie" Schulte Memorial Cup, F.C. "Fred" Lea Cup, T.L. "Coffey" Jones Memorial Trophy**
- **W.H.C. "Bert" Bickley Cup, Alan Eason Memorial Cup**

This achievement reflects consistency, depth across the season and the pride with which the group represented the Butcher Stripes.

Our core senior ambition was to win the Doughty Shield. While we narrowly missed out, we remained competitive to the end. Its importance — and the contribution of every team — was consistently reinforced via shared point updates. It will be a clear focus again in 2026.

Player pathway alignment strengthened. The Elite Development Program returned to a more individualised approach, improving accountability. Junior Colts integrated into Senior Colts preseason, with several contributing to the Colts 3 premiership. Multiple players debuted for the Queensland Reds (Men and Women), while *Will Cartwright* and *Ollie Harvey* signed full-time Australian 7s contracts. The club supported several overseas players with employment and accommodation, underscoring our commitment to transition and welfare.

*Jordan Cassidy*, in his second and final year supporting coach development, provided strong advice and feedback and went above expectations in assisting coaches who engaged. His work contributed positively to both senior and junior coach development. We wish him the best as he moves into a hands-on role at his Gaelic Football club.

The preseason featured high-level fixtures and strengthened partnerships, including the Canberra tour against Vikings Rugby and Gungahlin Eagles. In Toowoomba, our Premier, Colts and Women's teams played as curtain-raisers to Classic Wallabies vs Downs Team of the Decade, promoting regional engagement. We also hosted the Australian Club Championship, where First Grade were edged by Easts following a late comeback. Regional sides competed against our lower grades, and Bond Uni played Sydney Uni in the Women's match — a strong showcase of competitive pathways for both men and women.

Off the field, culture remained central through events such as Olympics Night, Cultural Night, quiz night, Kava in the butchery and team barbecues. The LooseHeadz mental health workshop was delivered, and juniors engaged with *Leigh Halfpenny* and *Ben John*. Following the passing of *Leapuna Havili*, the playing group held a prayer session, contributed to his family's GoFundMe and observed a minute's silence across all senior grades — a powerful show of unity.

In the Junior Program, participation grew to 52 teams (U6–U18 including Girls 7s). The new U6–U9 Metro Hub with GPS and Easts was well received, and Tri-Tag was successfully introduced for U6–U7. Tackle transition for U7s was supported through training integration and inclusion in Crosby 7s. Growth was seen in U13 (three teams), U16 (two) and Junior Colts (two). Premierships were secured by U14 Navy (Div 2) and Junior Colts Navy (Div 1). The Junior Academy improved preseason readiness, and the Holiday Clinic attracted over 100 participants. We also hosted 24 Japanese players for a week-long development camp with *Jude Gibbs* and *Dre Pakeho* — with confirmation of a 2026 return.

Challenges included incorrect BJRU grading for some older teams, which impacted experience, though proactive communication ensured player retention. Limited access to Windsor Park due to athletics uses reduced field capacity. Preseason disruption from weather and field closures forced adjustments, with Senior Teams training offsite — with thanks to Everton Park, Albany Creek and Pine Rivers. The bottom field continued to deteriorate and contributed to injury risk, prompting matches to shift to the top field. Redevelopment has now commenced, due for completion in February 2026.

Our community impact remained strong. Pasifika-designed jerseys were introduced for Premier Men and Women, blessed by *Ilivasi Tabua*. Jerseys were donated to players in Fiji, Samoa and PNG, with images showing powerful connection. Players helped raise funds for Ronald McDonald House Charities at Albion McDonalds, reinforcing community values.

### **Conclusion – Personal Statement**

This season reminded me why Brothers Rugby is such a special place. While four senior premierships and seeing our youngest players come through Little Brothers was rewarding, the real highlight was the people. As this was my first full season overseeing both junior and senior rugby, the responsibility wasn't lost on me. I have aimed to lead with care and integrity, keeping our players and community at the centre of every decision.

Our members lived our values the best they could — welcoming the Japanese players, supporting one another through the passing of *Leapuna Havili* and helping overseas players settle. We improved performance, advanced culturally and launched our first Pasifika jersey — a standout moment. Going forward, my focus is strengthening pathways, refining recruitment, developing coaches and supporting welfare, so anyone who wears the Butcher Stripes understands they're part of something bigger than rugby.

I'd like to thank our coaches, managers, volunteers, staff, committee, players and families for their commitment. Special thanks to the Board, Junior Committee, leadership groups, medics and admin support. I also acknowledge *Lochie Lawrence* and *Jason Neylon* for their guidance, their departure was felt, and their support highly valued.



In closing, I would like to thank you to all the Brothers' community for another tremendous year for the Club in 2025 and looking forward to an even bigger 2026!



It's a fitting tribute to Dick, a true giant of our Club and both Queensland & Australian Rugby and a small way to honour the over 60 years of outstanding service Dick has given to Brothers.

As a player, he always gave his all for Brothers playing across the grades from First to Fourth grade, as an office bearer & administrator he continued to serve with distinction as a President, Chairman, Treasurer and Committee member.

His acute business acumen and work across the wider Brisbane, Queensland and Australian corporate community meant that Dick was always will and able to be the Club's point man on a range of items like the planning and construction of Brothers Original Clubhouse in the early 1970's and subsequent upgrades. The negotiation to take over the use of Vic Walsh Oval in 1982 and the subsequent renegotiations with BCC on the Crosby Park lease for the next 35 years.

It was thanks to his standing as a true Brothers man and wonderful servant of the Club, that he was able to bring a former member, to assist in saving Brothers from extinction in the early 2000's.





The financial statements cover Brothers Rugby Club Inc. as an individual entity. Brothers Rugby Club Inc. is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 ('the Act').

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

**1 Basis of preparation**

In the opinion of the Management Committee, the association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the policies outlined in notes 1 and 2 of these statements.

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**2 Summary of material accounting policies**

**Income Tax**

Under current legislation, the Association is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

In accordance with the Club Constitution and operations, the Management Committee consider that the main purpose during the year is the encouragement of the game of Rugby, and as such income derived from all sources is exempt from income tax.

**Revenue and other income**

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

*Registrations and Membership*

Revenue from registrations and membership, and touch rugby are recognised when received.

*Grants*

Non-reciprocal grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the entity obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

*Donations*

Donations, pledges and bequests are recognised on an accrual basis and is recognised when the pledge is made. At that point it is considered that the economic benefit associated with the transaction will flow to the Association.

*Interest*

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

*Trust Distribution - Southside Unit Trust*

Trust income is recognised when the present entitlement to the distribution has been established.

**Sale of goods**

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

**Goods and services tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

##### **Capital expenditure**

Capital expenditure relates to the work undertaken prior to any development application (DA) being approved. This includes maintenance, upgrade of lights, field maintenance, other maintenance and professional fees associated with any DA process.

##### **Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

##### **Property, plant and equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its recoverable amount.

##### **Employee benefits**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits relating to long service leave balances are the expected amounts to be paid and is accrued when an employee reaches 7 years of employment. Changes in measurement of the liability are recognised in the Income Statement.

**Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

**Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements**

The Management Committee evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

**Key estimates**

**Investments**

- i. The club owns an asset being a perpetual membership at Ballymore. The historical cost of this asset is \$10,000. The lack of a ready market for this asset and the diminishing economic benefits following the reduction in games being played at Ballymore an impairment loss of \$9,999 has been raised to record the carrying value at \$1. This determination will be reviewed annually, and adjustments made in future periods if future market activity or estimate of future economic benefit indicates that such adjustments are appropriate.

**Property Plant & Equipment - useful life**

**Buildings and leasehold improvements**

- i. Crosby Park - during 2016 the Association signed a 10 year lease with Brisbane City Council which expires on 26 April 2026. There is no expectation that the lease would not be renewed at the expiration of the lease term. As such the Management Committee consider a 50 year useful life appropriate for buildings and leasehold improvements.

**Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result, and that outflow can be reliably measured.

**Right of use assets**

The association holds a licence to occupy Crosby Park. The Association:

**20 Capital Commitments – Masterplan**

The Club continues to be committed to the development to the proposed Master Plan for Crosby Park.

During 2021, Stage 1 to the Master Plan was completed and is fully funded and the application for Development Approval for Stages 2, 3, 4 & 5 was lodged with Brisbane City Council and approved.

During 2022 and 2023, development activities were suspended following discussions with the Queensland Government as the development of the local region is being considered in conjunction with the facility needs of the 2032 Olympic Games.

During 2024, the Club received confirmation from the Queensland Government to progress the development on the Club's existing site. Federal Government funding has been confirmed to support the development which is due to commence during 2025.

During 2025, the Club signed a new long term lease effective January 2026 at Crosby Park and is now in the process of finalising the construction design for the new building.
